SET EASTER INTER-NATION BROADCAST

Fr. Finn's Choristers To
Sing With Radio City
Symphony Orchestra

New York (NC)—The Paulist choristers, under the direction of Father Finn, have arranged an unusual Easter program for an international broadcast on Sunday, April 12 from 12:30 to 1:30 P. M., Eastern Standard Time, over a National Broadcasting Company network. The program will originate in the Radio City Music Hall Studio. It is believed that the choristers will have the largest audience of their long career. With the participation of the Symphony Orchestra of Radio City, it has been possible to present an unusual program which includes a seldom heard orchestral overture by Handel, the "Kammenel Ostrow" of Rubenstein, and the Victory Chorus from "Paradise Lost" by Dubois. Two novellas of special interest to music lovers will be offered. They are compositions of Father Finn. One is a choral legend for orchestra and chorus, "Brother Ars and St. Francis," and the second is a suite for orchestra with commentaries by solo voices and chorus, "A Paschal Suite."

Pope Honors London Catholic Journalist

London (NC) The editor of the "Univers," Herbert S. Dean, has been raised by the Holy Father to the rank of Knight Commander of the Order of St. Gregory the Great. He was created a Knight of the Order five years ago. Mr. Dean became editor of the "Univers" in 1917. He was the first Catholic journalist in this country to be honored by the Holy Father for journalistic work. Later Ernest Oldmixon, editor of the "Tablet," was awarded the K. C. S. G.
