Following this parish work, Monsignor Corrigan was named diocesan director of Catholic Charities and given charge of the Catholic Children's Bureau. On October 16, 1918 he was appointed professor in St. Charles' Seminary, and seven years later, on October 29, 1925, he was named rector of the seminary. Monsignor Corrigan, in addition to the rectorship of the seminary, is also professor of pastoral theology. He is a judge of the Metropolitan Court, moderator of the conferences and a member of the vigilance committee. He was the first retreat master of the Philadelphia Laymen's Week-end Retreat League commonly known as the Men of Modern, whose success has been attributed in no small measure to his counsel and guidance. He is actively identified with the alumni association of the St. Charles' Seminary, and for a time served as treasurer. He is known not only throughout the diocese but the country at large as one of the foremost spiritual orators and lecturers. Fluent in a number of languages, he is also famed for his brief and pithy discourses. Monsignor Corrigan observed his silver jubilee of the Major Seminary at home on June 6, 1928. In 1930 he was named a domestic prelate with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor. In June of the same year he was given the degree of Doctor of Literature by Duquesne University.
