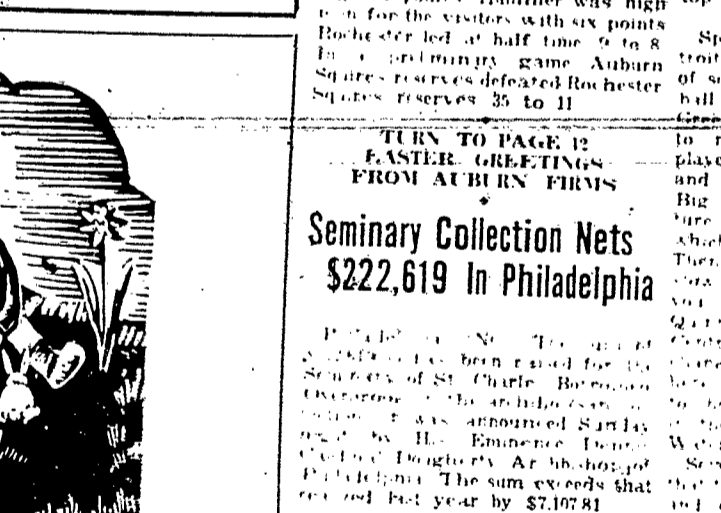
Retreat During Holy Week

POPE HONORS NOTED EDITOR

Vienna (N.C.) His Eminence Enrico Cardinal Sibilis, Papal Pro-Nuncio to Austria, has delivered to Staatsrat Dr. Frederic Funder, chief editor of the Reichspost-Crown with the Star of a Commander of the Order of St. Pius conferred upon him by His Holiness Pope Pius XI.

Cardinal Sibilis, who soon will leave to take up his office in the Sacred College in Rome, applied for the decoration for Dr. Funder, who ever since the foundation of the NCWC News Service, has been its Vienna correspondent. The Cardinal wished to evidence his appreciation of the work of the Catholic press in Austria, in which he showed high interest during his 14 years in Vienna.

In a few months Dr. Funder will complete the fortieth year of his journalistic activity. He has been chief editor of Reichspost for 33 years. Under his direction the paper has become one of the leading journals of Europe. It was founded early by the formation of the "Pious Association," a society of several hundred thousand members for the promotion of the Catholic press.

Dr. Funder is chairman of the Austrian National Committee for the International Exhibition of the Catholic press in 1937.
