

Nashville Bishop Is Consecrated

Davenport, Ia.—With almost two scores of the members of the hierarchy present, the Most Rev. William L. Adrien, former Vice-President of St. Ambrose College here and for the last 20 months pastor of St. Bridget's Church, Victoria, Ia., was consecrated Bishop of Nashville in the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart.

His Excellency the Most Rev. Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Apostolic Delegate to the United States, was the consecrator and the co-consecrators were the Most Rev. Moses Kelley, Bishop of Trenton and the Most Rev. Henry V. Tonn, Bishop of Davenport.

The Most Rev. Edward D. Howard, Archbishop of Portland Ore., delivered the sermon.

Archbishop Howard, who since he was Auxiliary Bishop of Ottawa, paid tribute to Bishop Adrien, whose promotion, he said, has come to him after 25 years of "faithful and distinguished service."

Work for Social Justice

Making mention of the Church's solicitude for the welfare of the laborer in this world, Archbishop Howard, in his sermon, mentioned the "condition of labor," and, again referring to Bishop Adrien, added:

"If I may, single out one quality in our new Bishop which is in line with many others, for the high office he is now to fill, let me mention his zealous and able attachment to this field of endeavor. He has not only exerted himself liberally, but he has labored valiantly to promote every movement that

has for its object the betterment of living conditions for working-men and their families.
