


Mrs. Madigan Says:

Notre Dame Survey Opposes Mixed Union

Sons of Mixed Marriages, Although Reared In The
Faith, Advise Against Union With
Non-Catholic Girl

The Religious Survey of Notre Dame University alumni
is just off the press, and it contains comments on mixed marriages
that should be brought to the attention of those who
may not be reached through college channels.

Furthermore, these comments are
pertinent to the subject now under
discussion in this column. Therefore,
I am taking the liberty of
quoting at length from the University's Bulletin.

Readers are asked to bear in
mind that these remarks were not
made by clergymen, Religious,
but by practical men-of-the-world
speaking from experience.
