Pronouncements of Two Popes on Social Justice To Be Reviewed By Noted Speakers at Columbus Civic Centre May 14, Under Sponsorship of Laity

Public observance in Rochester of two of the Church's greatest pronouncements on social justice will take place in the Columbus Civic Centre Auditorium on Thursday evening, May 14, at 8:15 o'clock. The meeting will be sponsored by the Catholic lay organizations of the city.

The observance to which the general public will be invited is a part of a nation-wide commemoration of the 45th anniversary of Pope Leo XIII's great Encyclical "The Condition of Labor" and the 50th anniversary of Pope Pius XI's Encyclical Letter, "Reconstructing the Social Order."

Speakers of note in the field of economics who are well grounded in the principles of the Church's teaching on social justice, will discuss the present economic problems in the light of the papal encyclicals. Most Reverend Edward Mooney, Bishop of Rochester and Episcopal Chairman of the National Catholic Welfare Conference is expected to attend.

Former Judge Philip H. Donnelly, General Chairman of the Commemoration has called a meeting of representatives of the Catholic organizations of laymen and women for Friday evening, May 1, in Parlor A of the Columbus Civic Centre to complete plans for the celebration.
