and the financial integrity of our country can sustain," the Rev. Bryan J. McEntegart, of the Catholic Charities of New York declared here yesterday in a talk on "Human Values in Social Welfare" at the Spring Conference of the Community Council of Philadelphia.

The priceless human value of self reliance must not be permitted to starve and shrivel in our people, Father McEntegart said. We must be on our guard lest the unemployed become unemployable. The morale and courage must be maintained by the insistent and ever-geing demand of all of us that a place be made for them in our national economic life.

Father McEntegart emphasized as four outstanding human values to be conserved: personal responsibility, self-reliance, family unity and neighborhood.

The depression, he declared, has rained blow after blow upon the security of our families. The great outpouring of relief has served to stem this tide and to save greatly the number of children forced out of their homes.

Three students addressed the assembled youth. One of them, Robert Hunka, said that "this meeting is being held early because we are not for peace as the American Student Union visualizes it."
