St. Ann's Take Early Lead In B Division, Wittman Tops Individual Parade With 706; Out-of-Town Teams Here Sunday

A smashing opening night total of 3132... The fourth annual Holy Name bowling tournament off to a flying start at Elm Hall.
Five comparative unknowns, hand-picked by the Lyell quint, walked right off with the tourney spotlight by picking together games of 905, 1094 and 1043 for a total that may cap the top prize of \$50 in the A division.

Four of the five Lyells cracked the 600 mark. A. Pizzello led the pack with 693 including games of 209, 248 and 245. A. Patti with 207 and 222 was right behind with 685.
J. Chivorch had 612, straining out and B. Trobia, 543. Of the fifteen games rolled by the five, nine were over the 200 mark to give opening night spectators one of the grandest pinning exhibitions in Holy Name tournament history.
Second place in the A division on opening night went to the Gas & Electric five with a 2929 total.
