## ROUND-WORLD TOUR TOUCHES NOTED SHRINES

New York—A new entry into the world's cruise sphere with an itinerary reaching many religious shrines and ceremonials has this week been announced by the Anchor Line, in cooperation with the American Express Company and Thomas Cook & Son.

"The new Round the World" cruise scheduled to leave New York Dec. 8 on the well-known transatlantic liner S. S. Transylvania will combine all the pleasures and thrills of a world's adventure with the opportunity of visiting the most noted of religious shrines and participating in the year's foremost religious ceremonials," says W. F. McGrath, passenger traffic manager of the line, who outlines some of the high lights of the vast world's program.

Heading southward from New York, Havana and the Canal Zone cities will be visited en route to Los Angeles and San Francisco. Honolulu and the Hawaiian Islands will introduce the fringe of the Far East with four days to be devoted to Japanese cities, temples and shrines through the port of Yokohama. Arriving at Manila, Feb. 3, five days have been allotted for the 33rd International Eucharistic Congress, with sightseeing visits of the Philippine metropolis and its environs.

From Singapore and the Malay Strait Settlements a journey will be made from Colombo in Ceylon to Kandy, temple shrine of "Buddha's Tooth." The approach to India will be through New Goa, capital of the Portuguese territory, with an automobile journey to Old Goa, once wealthiest city in India, and noted for its magnificent churches. Among the Holy Shrines of the Old city is the cathedral containing the body of Saint Francis Xavier. The tomb and shrine of this famous saint occupies a richly adorned side of the chapel. The body is contained in a silver coffin weighing 200 marks of silver and is unlocked by three sacred keys in the Church of San Jesus hangs a portrait of Saint Francis at the age of forty-four. Through out the district is everywhere evidenced of the first Christian colony in India.

The Holy Lands will be made from Haifa after the Egyptian visit to the pyramidal cities and the Nile and the Jordan. From the North East the Mediterranean voyage will proceed to Naples from where the Eternal City will be visited during the Easter celebrations with an auto journey to the buried city of antiquity at Pompeii.

## Father Hilbert Starts Trip to China Mission

### Requiem Mass Held For James I. Morrall

Beginning a 13,000 mile return trip to his mission parish in Chungking, Kwantung Province, China, the Rev. Charles Hilbert, Mary Immaculate Church, Rochester, N. Y., left for San Francisco by way of the Santa Fe Trail.

From San Francisco Father Hilbert will sail on a Dollar Line boat for Hongkong, by way of Honolulu, Yokohama and Japan.

Arriving in Hongkong, Father Hilbert faces a 10-day journey into the interior. The only means of transportation is by way of sampan, a small Chinese river boat.

The entire journey Father Hilbert estimated, would take about six weeks.

After spending 10 years in the Mission field in and about Chungking, Father Hilbert returned to Rochester last fall to assist in the new Mission Church and settlement.

Father Hilbert expressed his deep appreciation to the Catholic people of the diocese for their many kindnesses and generosity and said they wished he had the opportunity of thanking each one individually.

The Missionary Society of Saint Father Hilbert is a member of the American Foreign Mission Society, better known as Maryknoll, was the first distinctive American Society to enter the foreign mission field.
