**NATIONAL SCOUTING OFFICIAL TALKS TO LEADERS IN DIOCESE**

Advanced interest in Boy Scout work in Catholic parishes throughout the diocese, Kenneth E. Cook, of New York, Assistant in the Director of the Division of Operations, Boy Scouts of America, spent two days in Rochester this week conferring with Catholic Scout officials. He was the guest of the Rev. Gerald C. Lambert, Diocesan Chaplain of Boy Scouts.

En route on what he termed "Cook's Tour," Mr. Cook brought with him a number of interesting facts about the national organization. He met with the Diocesan Scout Board here and with Boy Scout executives in the 8 Councils-Areas operating in this diocese. He particularly stressed development of Catholic leadership in scouting.

The success of a Catholic Scout Chaplain in the West in interesting parents in the value of Catholic boys in scouting was outlined by Mr. Cook.

Born in Canada and now a naturalized citizen of the United States, Mr. Cook brings a splendid educational background to scout work. He holds the Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts Degree from the University of Western Ontario, where he majored in philosophy and education. Following two years of post graduate work in the University of Notre Dame, he received a certificate in Boy Guidance, also a Master of Arts in education. He made a splendid record while a student of the Twelfth National Training School of the Boy Scouts of America.

While at college he was president of the Student Foreign Mission Society, president of the Holy Name Society and editor of the college weekly paper. He has had wide experience in camp-director, Scout Executive and in social work in Montreal and Buffalo.

**Children's Choir In Demonstration of Liturgical Music**

Auburn - A choir of 450 children's voices, representing the five parishes of Auburn, gave a demonstration of the liturgical music Saturday morning, May 2, at Holy Family church. The choir sang the Gregorian Mass of which the Rev. John M. Duffy, Superintendent Catholic Schools Diocese of Rochester, was celebrant. The Rev. Dean John A. Conway, dean of the Rev. John B. Crowley sub-deacon, of the various schools, which included Holy Family, St. Mary's, St. Anthony's, St. Hyacinth's, St. Ignace's, St. Hyacinth's. It is the first time in Auburn that all parishes have united in a liturgical music demonstration.

After the Mass Father Duffy addressed the priests, nuns and laity saying: "The eternal fitness and usefulness of things requires that the music of the Church be substantially and not merely different from that of the world and the bathroom. We with the pope and bishops in sincerely endeavoring to destroy the unworthy ideas of sacred music that obtain here or less generally at the present time."

The music which is fit to accompany the sacrifice on the altar must necessarily be imbued with the same spirit of reverence, humility and meditation. The melodies of the Church must be unworshipful, chaste, holy and artistic.

Gregorian chant is that song which excites the minds of the faithful to piety and devotion. It is the music which if sung in church with care and devotion is most willingly heard by devout persons.

During the Mass the Rev. Leo C. Monney, the Rev. William F. Davis and the Rev. Lawrence Ryan were present in the sanctuary.
