"...but later, Jim, doesn't the Bible say, 'Whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life?' Then why all these other things you Catholics must believe?"

"Because, Ben, the Bible tells us about these other things, too. How about the Commandments, Baptism, Penance, fasting, eating the flesh of the Son of Man and lots else? About believing only well. St. James puts it rather aptly when he says, '...the devil is also able to believe at times.' And again: 'Faith without works is dead'."

"But St. James—wasn't it his writings declared 'an apostle of straw'?" "Yes, but by Martin Luther, because if St. James was right, then Luther was wrong and Luther didn't want to be considered wrong."

You see, Ben, when a human being starts out to reform a God-founded religion, he must change the God-inspired writings of the Bible by additions, alterations and misinterpretations. But doing that he loses at the same time his religion he wants or even thinks to be right; but he sets a dangerous precedent.

"If one man can change religion why not another and another; and as it has been until today we have 300 Protestant sects and each of them a house divided against itself. So—now—Modestum has entered into a divisional war to defend himself against the Industrial Revolution, Heaven, Hell and the Immortality of the soul and invalidizing the entire Bible or any parts of it that contradict his theories. Because of this class of thought, with no authority to state what is and is not truth, I cannot blame the devout Protestant who today is almost forced to resign himself to the new creed. I accept Christ as my Savior," and letting it go at that.

"But we Catholics, Ben, have the divine prescription for salvation in the God-guided tradition of the Church, verified by the true interpretation of the God-inspired Scriptures. Surely we accept Him who commanded the medicine; but we do not accept the general idea of suddenly up there in the shell and wait for its efficacy. No, we take the bottle regularly, shake well to get off the ingredients, and then take our medicine exactly as directed on the label."
