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## Lehman Signs Bus Measure Into Statute

### Long Battle To Secure Free Bus Service For Catholic Pupils Ends

#### Effective Sept. 1

### Ex-Minister Hails Bill As He Joins In Its Un- animous Support

Albany — Governor Lehman's signature yesterday enacted into law the Kelly-McCreery school bus bill providing for free transportation of pupils of parochial and private schools.

The Governor's action followed unanimous approval of the measure by both the senate and the Legislature.

Gov. Lehman vetoed a somewhat similar measure last year on the grounds that it was unconstitutional.

Effective Sept. 1, the bill which now becomes an act of the Legislature, will provide for the transportation of Catholic children in rural areas and in places where public transportation is not available.

Paris (The exhumation of the body of little Guy de Fontgallan has since more directed attention to the extraordinary spread of devotion to him throughout the world.)

To his interest have been attributed up to the present 22 cures, 156,000—green and 14,000—red, and 771 convocations of young men who have entered the seminaries or novitiates to replace Guy de Fontgallan who had wanted to be a priest.

More than a hundred biographies of this boy have been written. The only pamphlet, "A Child's Soul," written by the Comtesse de Fontgallan, Guy's mother, has been translated into 12 languages or dialects. More than 100 articles about him have appeared in journals and magazines.

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## FIRST AIRSHIP MASS SAID ON HINDENBURG

### Flying Priest Offers Sacrifice As Huge Zep Flies To America

On Board the Hindenburg  
While this giant dirigible sped over the Atlantic 250 miles southeast of Cape Race the other morning, the Rev. Paul Schulte, Germany's famous "flying priest" was celebrating the first Mass ever said in an airship.

While dinner was being served, Father Schulte said the Mass on an emergency altar erected against one of the big windows of the dirigible. The priest, who is a member of the Society of the Holy Sacrament, said he had never before said a Mass in an airship.

Rev. 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## Pope Pius XI Brands Communism 'Great Universal Danger'

### The Holy Father Speaks:

VATICAN CITY — Here are some highlights on the address of Pope Pius XI at the opening of the World Catholic Press Exposition this week:

First, the greatest and the most general peril is certainly Communism in all its forms and degrees. It threatens all openly and assaults individual dignity, the sanctity of the family, the safety of civic life and above all, religion.

"It (Communism) is a great and a universal danger which threatens the entire world."

"THERE is no substitute for the Catholic Church because it is the sole preserver of true and genuine Christianity."

"IN fact, outside the Catholic Church, after the real devastation of so-called Free Thought, of Liberalism and of diverse pretended reformations, what remains of the doctrine of Jesus Christ given by the Gospels and legitimate tradition?"

"THE Church recognizes the State's own sphere of action and teaches and commands its conscientious respect but it cannot admit that politics excludes morals and cannot forget the precept of its Divine Founder, Who, according to the strong and profound expression of our great Manzoni, commanded her to deal with the moral and master it everywhere it enters and must enter."

"CERTAINLY it does not make good and wise the policy of those hindering the life and action of the Church or hindering only her full, free action and development, as thus they renounce the valid and precious contribution which the Church alone can bring to public safety, real peace and public welfare."

"An immense amount of literature has been widely circulated putting into full and definite light this program which already is in the practice or is being attempted in Russia, Mexico, Spain, Uruguay and Brazil."

"It is a great and a universal danger which threatens the entire world. The universality of the program of Communism is irrevocably proclaimed, invoked, procured and then promoted by propaganda."

"This propaganda is the more dangerous when it comes to the attention of the young. In appearance, less impious in its aim to penetrate into places which would be less accessible were that violence of the means, it obtains in places in which tolerance, an inextinguishable advantage for the cause of evil and one of the most serious consequences for the cause of good."

"You will say, when you return to your respective countries," Pope Pius XI said, "that you have seen the Common Father of all believers in the Vicar of Christ. In the face of him, you have found him gravely preoccupied with the great peril that is threatening all the world and which, in certain parts of the world, already has brought about the greatest damage."

"Particularly I wish to say that the Common Father does not cease to point out the dangers that many, too many, seem to ignore, not recognizing their gravity and imminence."

"Substitute for Church  
You will say that the Common Father sees that there are forces at work which tend to bring about the realization of these dangers and that he warns that there is a neglect of effort to safeguard the public morals, to arouse a defense against and to bring about a remedy for that neo-paganism to which immorality is so easily and

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### Makes Historic Statement At Opening Of Vatican Press Exhibit

### Hits Persecution

### Says Power Of Catholic Press Feared In Russia And Germany

Vatican City—His Holiness Pope Pius XI branded Communism as "a great and a universal danger which threatens the entire world" in an address marking the opening of the World Catholic Press Exposition.

Speaking before journalists from thirty-five nations of Europe and America and thirty-three states in Asia, Africa and Australia, His Holiness scored state interference with religion in Russia and Germany.

He said quite significantly: "Certainly it does not make good and wise the policy of those hindering the life and action of the Church or hindering only her full, free action and development, as thus they renounce the valid and precious contribution which the Church alone can bring to public safety, real peace and public welfare."
