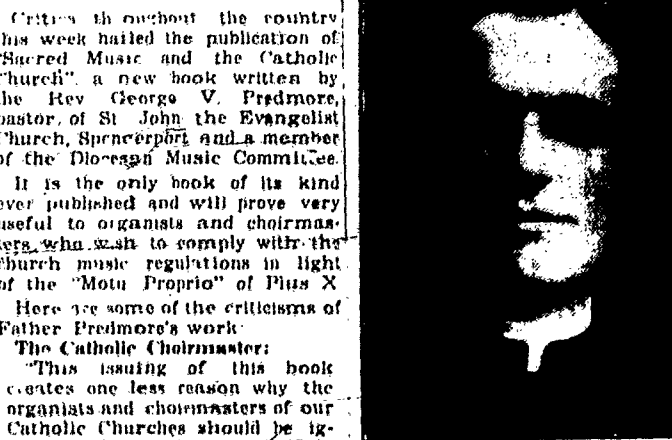

MISSIONARY WITHOUT A ROOM Bishop Asks for Fifty Dollars

We have a letter from Bishop Khroum, the Catholic Bishop of Egypt. Our readers know of Bishop Khroum because we have written about him several times. The Bishop is very energetic and is constantly going from one part of his diocese to another. The Bishop asks about ten days with the Bishop and he marveled at the energy of this man. Here is his letter: "You know from your visit to our missions what we are able to accomplish with a small sum of money. Sometimes when I see how necessary it is to have a room, how little is necessary to obtain them, I am saddened. It is so sad that I have even a few dollars to spare for the missions. Here is an example: There is a young parish priest—he is only twenty-six years old—and he is in the village of Kom-Sheikh in upper Egypt. During the last year this priest has been sick twice. The reason is—he is without a home. He lives with one family one month and with another the next month. He writes to me and tells me he would like to have a room. I would like to see him and to see the chapel that would provide him with a home for Fifty Dollars. Here is the exact answer that I sent him: 'Dear Father: You ask me for Fifty Dollars for the building of a room by extending the school roof, by the addition of a window and a door. You tell me this is necessary for you for the winter. I find myself unable to accede to this most reasonable request. Pray, dear Father, and I will pray with you that Divine Providence may send a benefactor who will enable you to live under less rigorous conditions.' So far I have not been able to give this priest the Fifty Dollars. You realize that his work is important and he cannot be an efficient priest unless he is living under these conditions. You can see for yourself that he is not extravagant and he will be satisfied with the little that he asks. Surely somebody will answer this appeal. Fifty Dollars is not much to give a missionary priest a room for his home. If you cannot send Fifty Dollars, send us anything you can spare. Do not let another winter go by without this priest having at least a room for shelter."
