Doctors Score Birth Control On Two Points

Claim Birth Rate In Educated Groups Dropping; Poor Go Unaided

Methodists Silent
Refuse to Make Pronouncement on Birth Control By Large Vote

Kansas City—The declaration that birth control "propagandists" were to blame for an alarming drop in child bearing in educated families and a charge that these same "propagandists" had failed to aid the poor whose cause they professed to champion was contained in a report made to the American Medical Association by a committee which made an extensive investigation.

Reporting to the convention of the organization, which represents the medical profession, the committee stated that it had found that the birth rate in educated families had dropped 50 per cent since 1910, while in the lower income groups it had fallen only 25 per cent.

In an address to the convention Dr. B. S. Smith of Godfrey, Ill., declared that sterilization is not the solution of the insanity problem. While sterilization does permit some persons to lead normal lives, he stated, it does not solve the problem of the insane.

A crucifix that had been removed from a university building has been restored to its original position.

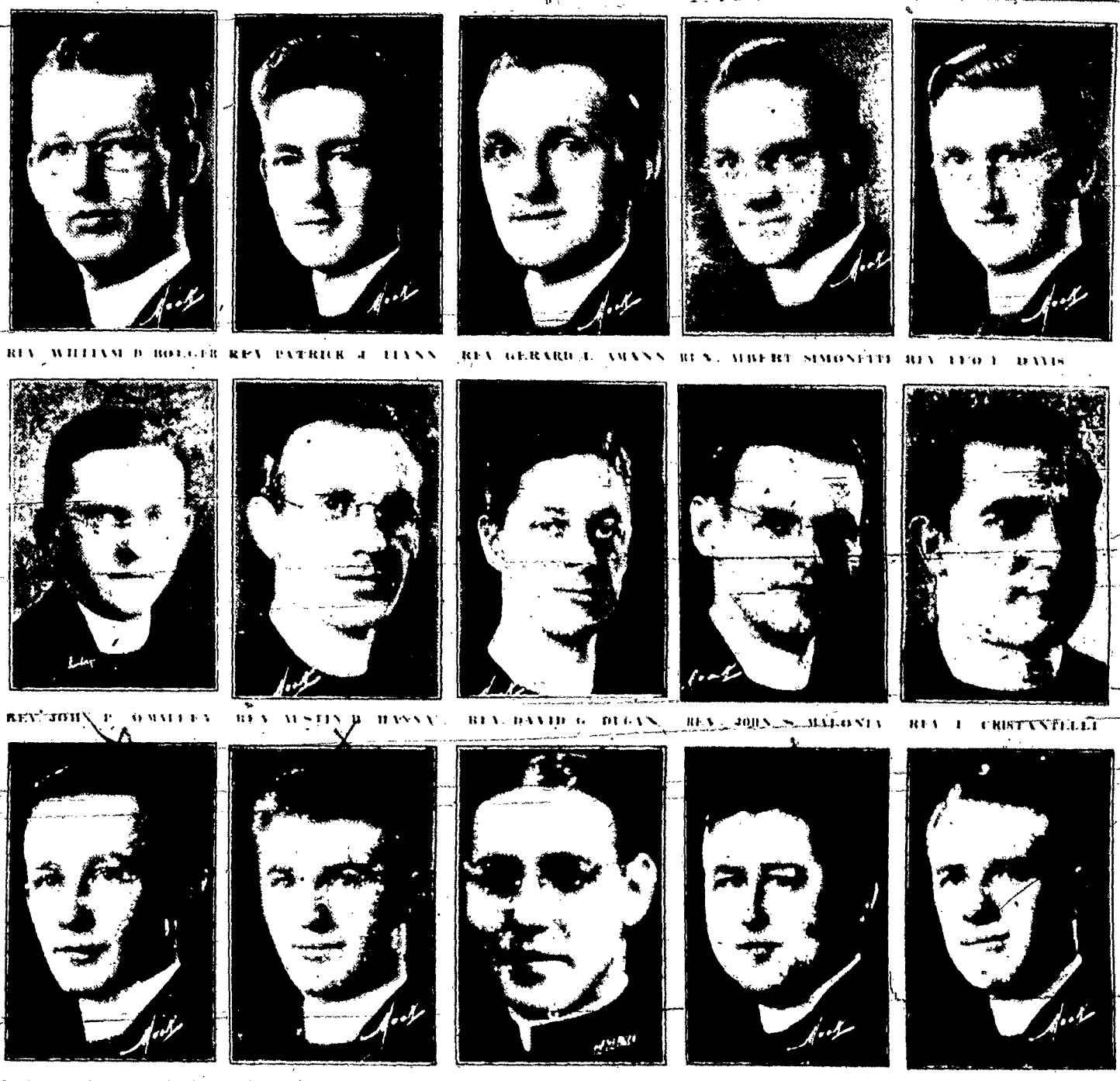
