POPE PIUS XI URGES WIDER USE OF RADIO

Sends Message to Catholic Radio Broadcasting Congress at Prague

Prague, International of Catholic activity in the field of radio broadcasting is encouraged in a message from His Holiness Pope Pius XI, transmitted through His Eminence Eugenio Cardinal Pacelli, Papal Secretary of State, to the Second International Catholic Broadcasting Congress here.

Addressers From America Representatives of some 15 countries attending the Congress, and experts representing Dutch, Belgian, French, German, Austrian and Italian stations led in the discussion of radio broadcasting from the Catholic point of view.

Dr. Max A. Jordan, Continental representative of the National Broadcasting Company of America and Cesar Seeschinger, representative of the Columbia Broadcasting System, addressed the Congress on radio broadcasting in the United States.

Message of President His Holiness will be the activities of Catholic broadcasting, President said, just as he follows all activities which contribute toward the stabilization of conditions existing today.
