THE GUFFEY DECISIONS OF U.S. SUPREME COURT

The Guffey decisions bring out clearly that Catholic social teaching is un-constitutional. But since the unemployment of a dozen million people is very real...

Catholic social teaching is un-constitutional in a special way, the Guffey decision reveals. The Guffey Act said that in soft coal the maximum hours of work nationally would be what more than two-thirds of the operators in the country at large and more than half to miners agreed to and that the minimum wages by districts would be what the same proportions agreed to in the districts.

Catholic social teaching says that Catholicism is not only a religion, but also a social philosophy.

The Encyclical of Pius XI says that organized economic self-government under the guidance of political government is a right and natural way to form a more perfect union.
