Under the direction of Nicola A. Mantani, who mounted a 30-foot platform to conduct his massed choir, the singing of the children was enhanced by the rendering of the Proper in false-bordone style by the Maestro Pie Filippino of Villa Luchini, Montevideo, the text by Sister Carolina Jonata, who composed the music for the occasion.

An Offertory motet, "Jesu Rex Admirabilis," by Palestrina, was sung by 600 girls from the academy of the Holy Child of the diocese. The organ accompaniments were played by Joseph A. Murphy of Newark. The Mass was broadcast by the Columbia Broadcasting System on a national and international basis.

After the Solemn Pontifical Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, the Most Rev. Thomas J. Walsh, Bishop of Newark, read the Pope's greetings and benediction to the officers and members of the St. Gregory Society.

A sermon on the purpose of ecclesiastical music, emphasizing the uses of the chant and polyphony was preached by the Rev. Dr. James P. Kelley, of South Orange, N. J.

On Friday afternoon there was a varied program of liturgical music in which several hundred school children and college girls took part. A demonstration of Gregorian chant in Latin and English was given by a group of boys from Scranton, Pa., under the direction of the Sister Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary Organ Academy. This was followed by a group of a cappella numbers in three and four-part choruses rendered by 50 young women forming the Glee Club of St. Joseph's College, Clifton, N. J., directed by Sister Regina-Dolores S.S.J.

The methods and principles of presenting music to first-grade children was demonstrated by Sister Maria Fuchs, of the Sisters of Charity, with a group of students from St. Vincent's School, Madison, N. J. The demonstration was repeated with the Junior class of the College of St. Elizabeth, Convent, N. J. A group of high school girls from St. Dominic's Academy, Jersey City, was directed in a Gregorian chant lesson by Sister Mercedes, O.S.D.

A school music demonstration of a demonstration of school music, chant and liturgical music was given by the School Sisters of Notre Dame directed by Sister Mary John S.S.N.D. The session closed with a demonstration of teaching music to the blind, given by the St. Joseph's School for the Blind, Jersey City. This demonstration, conducted by Sister Catherine Verano, S.S.J., was a most interesting and instructive one.

An informal dinner was held on Thursday evening at which the Most Rev. Thomas H. McLaughlin, Auxiliary Bishop of Newark, spoke on the work undertaken in the diocese by Bishop Walsh in establishing the Newark Diocesan Institute of Music, which is under the direction of Mr. Montani.

Among other speakers were the Rev. John Kiernan of Newark, Mr. Justice J. Ward of New York, Mr. Mark Andrews, noted composer, the Rev. Leo Mooney, of Rochester, N. Y., Elmer A. Steffen, of Indianapolis, and Mr. Montani.

Friday's chief liturgical function was the Solemn Pontifical Mass of Requiem at St. Patrick's Cathedral, with Bishop Walsh as celebrant. The Gregorian singing was rendered by 350 nuns of the diocese, all members of the St. Cecilia Guild, directed by Sister Mary Montani with Mr. Murphy at the organ.

Officers Are Re-elected
The annual election of officers followed the Mass. All the present officers were re-elected for a two-year period. They are:
The Rev. John M. Peller of St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester, N. Y., president; the Rev. James A. Boylan of St. Charles Seminary, Oshkosh, Wis., vice-president; Mr. Steffen, secretary; George Fischer, New York, treasurer; and Mr. Montani, editor of the Society's official publication, "The Catholic Choirman."

A discussion on Hymnology was given by the Rev. John G. Hacker, S.J., of Loyola College, Baltimore. Father Hacker voiced a protest against the indiscriminate use of sacred music in the mass, in popular tunes and street songs. His hearers voted that he prepare a resolution on the subject to be submitted later to the Society's Governing Board for approval.

Friday evening a sacred concert was given under the auspices of the Newark Institute of Sacred Music. Among the artists was M. Mauro-Cottone, organist of the New York Philharmonic, who played the "March and Fugue by Guilmant." The vested choir of Blessed Sacrament Church, New York, directed by Warren S. Foley and composed of 30 men and boys, sang three Kyries in Gregorian, polyphonic and modern settings and concluded with the Saint Saens' Ave Verum.

Auburn Sunday, May 31 was a red-letter day for the Young Ladies Sodality of St. Mary's Church. In the morning at the 9:30 Mass 142 of its members received Communion in a body immediately after Mass they motored to Springville Inn for their annual Communion breakfast.

The President expressed her appreciation to the delegates and directors representing the local parish sodalities.
