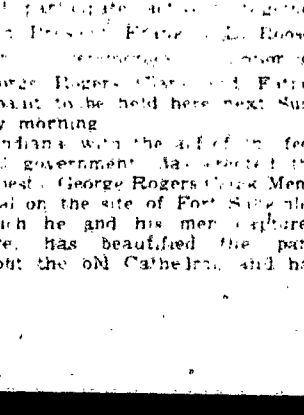
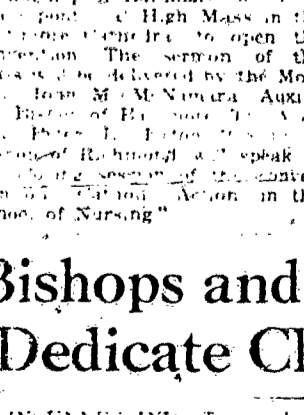
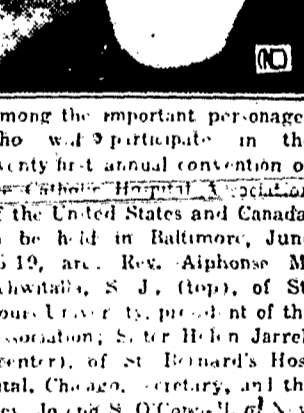
**TALK ON WAY**

### ISSUE PROTEST AGAINST TRIAL OF CATHOLICS

**Rochester Minister and Rabbi Sign Names to National Petition**  
NEW YORK — A "solemn protest" of much vigor is made against the "almost unique brutality and unfairness" of the Nazi Government of Germany in its attack on the good name of the Catholic clergy of that land, in a statement made public here and signed by 48 Protestant and Jewish clergymen, many of them nationally known.

Recent placing of 276 clergy on trial in Germany on charges of immorality was the subject of the statement. Significantly the ministers and rabbis note that since every vestige of a free German Catholic Press has long since disappeared, no adequate means of public opinion can be obtained from any source not identified with the German Propaganda Office.

The clergymen testify to the high reputation of the Catholic clergy in Germany for upright living and loyalty to moral principle, noting that the German Protestant clergy attest this.

The statement in part follows: We the undersigned lodge a solemn protest against the almost unique brutality and unfairness of the most recent attack launched by the government of Germany charging Catholic clergy with gross immorality. He who stunts his purpose for his and the religious orders many dioceses and numerous individuals were robbed of their funds during the course of the now well-known trials for violation of the foreign exchange law under which exorbitant fines and long prison sentences were imposed.

After this effort failed to accomplish the desire of the Nazi Government, widespread efforts were made to pin the label of traitor on all priests who opposed Nazi teaching in any form. Now it is the good name of the Catholic clergy that is being destroyed.

We hope that so the ultimate suppression of all universal Jewish and Christian beliefs by the totalitarian state can be most speedily effected.

Not First of Its Kind  
The reported trial of 276 Priests in Cologne for alleged immoral practices is not the first of its kind in the Propaganda Office. It is a continuation of the support in charges have been in progress during nearly a year. Most are accusations of the English Press carried out without charges being made to the effect that press had been tampered and photographs faked. The absence of local authorities and religious commissions have been requested for possible removal of offenses by individuals, but the excess of poverty, paucity and meagerness.

### Doctors Oppose Birth Control Propaganda

**American Medical Association Group Directs Charge At Contraceptive Organizations; Hits Doctors Who Aid These Movements**  
CHICAGO — Its first practical propaganda directed to the public by lay bodies organized solely for the purpose of disseminating such propaganda or test the support of contraceptive information was circulated in a report submitted to the American Medical Association, by that organization's special committee appointed to study contraceptive practices.

This disapproval was registered in recommendations made by the committee at the conclusion of a report made at the recent annual convention of the association and will be published in the official publication of the American Medical Association.

Referring to these propaganda groups, the committee said: "Your committee deprecates the support of such agencies by members of the medical profession. We feel that an entirely false sense of values with respect to the important function of child bearing and of parenthood has been created by the activities of such organizations."

Relatively Uninformed  
Referring to the use of contraceptive agents earlier in the report, the committee said: "Early in this work, it became evident that most people, including physicians, are relatively uninformed regarding the entire subject."

**Pastoral Letter Praises Faith of Young Men and Women**  
AMSTERDAM — In a joint Pastoral addressed to the entire Catholic youth of the country, the German Hierarchy warns against a new religion that is being preached, "a doctrine not born of God but of blood" and against the figure of the Lord, the Victor of Golgotha, and whose own vision is clouded and "deprived of that light which shineth in darkness and the darkness does not comprehend it."

The Pastoral was read in all the Catholic churches of Germany.

The Bishops admonish the Catholic youth of Germany to be vigilant and calm, to put on the shield of faith to extinguish the fiery darts of anger, and to take unto you the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.
