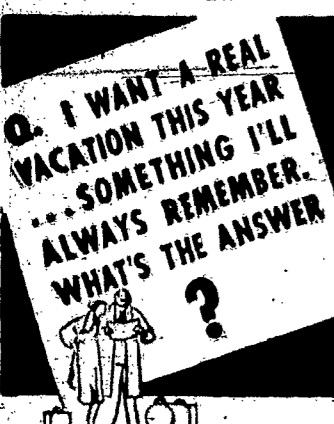

city development is a consummation of contemporary history. The Christian foundation of great and that guide the human mind in its influential schools have been effectively sapped. The process has gone on almost imperceptibly and from within, like the destructive work of termites in a building.

"The superstructure has therefore sunk and sagged under its own weight until from without it presents a distorted pattern, and from within it gives a view of the world and of man's place in the world that is definitely lowered and oftentimes positively distorted like the view from the sagging floor of a sinking house.

"The pathetic results are evident all about us—nowhere perhaps more so than in the recent works of one of the foremost exponents of an unchristian educational philosophy who speaks of educating as the adjustment of the growing mind to the chaotic conditions of the modern world. That statement, if it really means what it obviously seems to mean, sums up a philosophy of confusion. It is the unchristian cry of despair on the part of one who surrenders the hope that education without Christ can purify our life, or that there can be any stable foundation in principle for the complicated superstructure of modern unchristian education.

"In striking contrast, your University stands high and firm on the foundation of faith in Christ built in Peter which Christ Himself set in place. It stands high enough to give you a view of the world and of man's place in the world that is in proper perspective. It does not look out the distant horizons that reveal the eternal hills. It enables you to look back over the history of the world and to see, as one of our 'heavenly messengers' puts it, that 'the soul takes away from man the supernatural, strangely enough you have left not the natural but the unnatural.

REPORT SHOWS 616 STUDY CLUBS ACTIVE

5,000 In Diocese Study Clubs; Holy Family, Auburn Leads, Has 35

Final returns on the adult study club program from the various dioceses in the diocese revealed that the Aquinas faculty members' report that the number of study clubs has increased steadily since Fall when the program was first announced.

Both the large number of clubs that have been formed throughout the diocese, and the enthusiastic participation that have been shown by the members, are a clear indication of the movement.

Deeply gratifying have been the enthusiastic comments of many parishioners, who see in the study club a powerful means of creating a solid Catholicity in the parish, through an intelligent understanding of Catholic doctrine.

The final report of the number of clubs established reveals a total of 616.

These clubs have been organized on a permanent basis, and their leaders have indicated their intention of continuing their study in the fall.

This means that 60% of all the clubs which were organized in the early spring held meetings regularly each week.

In all, five thousand people throughout the diocese participated in a special study of the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist, the office of the Mass and the explanation of its Sacred Ceremonies.

Holy Family Leads
The parish claiming the distinction of having the largest number of clubs is Holy Family in Auburn, reporting a total of 35 permanent clubs.

Other parishes in the Auburn Diocese reporting large numbers are the Immaculate Conception in Hudson, 25; St. Mary's in Auburn, 21; St. Alphonsus in Auburn, 22.

In the Rochester Diocese Blessed Sacrament parish leads with a total of 24 clubs. Rev. Geo. Prendergast, pastor, reports 22 clubs, and in the Rochester Diocese with a total of 15. Holy Rosary reports 13; St. John the Evangelist 10.

Waverly has 29.

The largest parish in the Elmira Diocese was St. James in Waverly with a total of 29. In the Corning Diocese, St. Mary's, Dansville, with a total of 15.

One of the most effective results of the spring session of the study clubs has been the great amount of Catholic literature introduced into the home, particularly in relation to the central Act of Catholic worship.

At the close of the seasons in many of the parishes pastors exhibited the film on the Mass. Where this was not possible all club members were brought together in a single group for an explanation of the sacred vestments and their liturgical meaning.

The Rev. John M. Duffy, Director of the Conference, has already begun to make arrangements for the Fall Study Club Meetings. Announcements in regard to the subject and the time of the meetings will be made at a later date.

Sunday's Mass

A GUIDE TO THE LITURGICAL YEAR

The Holy Eucharist was instituted by our Saviour Jesus Christ. It is necessary to commemorate this great event on another day, when their minds should not be so occupied with sorrow for the suffering of their Saviour.

Its observance began early in the thirteenth century under the influence of St. Juliana. It was celebrated in the diocese of Liège in 1240. Six years later it had spread throughout Germany. In 1264 it was extended to the entire Church by Pope Urban IV. This Pope gave it the name Corpus Christi. Later, the procession which is still a civic observance in Catholic countries, made it more prominent and more dear to the faithful. The text of the Mass is written by St. Thomas of Aquinas.

This Sunday falls within the Octave of Corpus Christi, that is within its eight day celebration in many places. The procession made today is a remnant of last Thursday.

The lesson teaches us that the Eucharist should continually make us remember that Christ lives us. The Gospel tells us what we are not to have for staying away from Holy Communion.

Sisters of Poor Get New Mother-General
CINCINNATI—The Sister of the Poor of St. Francis, whose American provincial house is located at St. Clara Convent, Hartwell, have been informed of the election of Sister Rufina as the new Mother-General of the Order at the election at the motherhouse in Aix-la-Chapelle, Germany.

Notification of the election of Sister Rufina, who for the past six years had been Superior of the Sisters of the Poor of St. Francis establishment at Frankfort-on-the-Main, Germany, came in a cablegram from delegates from the American houses now in Europe.

Kelly, the Rev. John V. Loughlin, the Rev. Francis A. Marks, the Rev. Joseph C. Meriel and the Rev. Arthur A. Weitzer.

The final degree went to the Rev. Charles J. Mahoney, associate superintendent of schools of the diocese of Rochester.

A master of arts degree also was received by the Rev. Francis T. Penny who was ordained to the priesthood at St. Patrick's Cathedral Saturday for the diocese of Cheyenne, Wyoming.

To senior accounting major given for excellence in accounting by John R. Wilkinson, dean of the Niagara School of Business in this city was awarded to Henry D. Kennedy of Niagara Falls.
