Need Writers of His Type We Catholics especially have reason to feel sorrow for his departure. Confronted by the mass of neo-pagan literature that is daily pouring forth from the ubiquitous press, we have sore need of such writers as Chesterton.

But we have our consolation too. He died, no doubt as he would have wished to die. Says the London "Evening Standard": "Recently he had returned from his holiday in France which included a pilgrimage to Lourdes and was taken ill almost as soon as he reached his home. As he lay dying, his wife and secretary knelt in prayer at his bedside. A bright light burst from the feet of crucifix on the bedroom wall. He had made his peace with God while here, and may his soul rest in the eternal peace of the hereafter."

Press "Full and Fair" In an article of this kind there cannot be much added to what has appeared today in the daily press, and I must confess that the daily press has been full and fair on this occasion. In the New York "Evening Standard" says the editor of the New York Times: "G. K. Chesterton is not the last of his kind to become immortal, but the reason why his powers had declined, but they had not."

He continued to pour out his paradoxes on subjects that they got in his way. "We speak to truth, not always through paradox, but neither is it always through solemnity."
