Bishop John A. Duffy Asks Reconsecration To Ideals Of Society

Flickering Candles and Outdoor Altar Present Magnificent Spectacle As Holy Name Men Renew Pledge; Archbishop Mooney Greet's Audience

As a huge sparkling reproduction of a non-france raised the Blessed Sacrament to the top of a 100-foot altar and 10,000 candles flickered in the soft June night, members of the Rochester Diocese Holy Name Union pledged anew loyalty and devotion in the presence of their society in an imposing spectacle at Red Wing Stadium Sunday.

Messages urging reconsecration to ideals of the Holy Name Society were brought by the Most Rev. Archbishop Edward Mooney in his address of welcome and by the Most Rev. John A. Duffy, Bishop of Syracuse, guest speaker.

Hymns of honor in the outdoor sanctuary, colorfully decorated with concealed lights were taken by the Most Rev. Archbishop Thomas F. Hickey, minister of the diocese, and officers of the Holy Name Society.

Benediction imparted

Climax of the annual rally of the Holy Name men came when Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament was imparted by Archbishop Mooney.

In calling upon the men to reconsecrate themselves to the purposes of the Holy Name Society, Bishop Duffy said that in upholding the sacredness and paramount importance of the divine law of reverence the Society is in effect calling attention to the entire law of God.

I, invites its members to reform themselves as individuals and in all their social relations," said Bishop Duffy. "We have made a mess of life for ourselves and for our children by self-indulgence and self-will. The Holy Name Society pleads with all for a return to the will of God.

Par-Roching Influence

"It is not easy to estimate the far-reaching influence for good exerted by so large a number of men as are assembled here tonight. The welfare of the community, domestic and civil, depends on the intelligence and virtue of its citizens. Impregnated with the principles you profess, you minister directly to the social and moral life of this country.

"Your good influence on public welfare is indeed indirect, but none the less, the more effective in that you avoid intervention in questions of politics. The spiritual object of your society, honoring the Holy Name and obeying the commandments of God in your individual contribution to human welfare. "The purity of life in word and deed," Bishop Duffy declared, "will prove your right to the title Holy Name Man." Say more, said the Bishop, is a powerful influence on the moral standards of your fellow citizens.

Archbishop Mooney told the men they were making not only a difference in their own lives but a contribution to the welfare of the nation.
