NAZARETH BUYS COLLEGE SITE IN PITTSFORD

69 Acre Lomb Tract Purchased For \$110,000; Await Building Plans

The Nazareth College of the future will be built on a 69 acre tract of land in Monroe Avenue, Pittsford, a short distance from the present motherhouse of the Sisters of St. Joseph.

Negotiations for the purchase of the land from the Adolph Lomb estate were being concluded this week by Attorney James K. Egley, representing the school and Frank E. Devana, attorney for Mrs. Emily Lomb.

The list price of the estate, located between Sutherland Street and West Jefferson Road, is set at \$110,000.

The purchase is the first step in the new Nazareth College to replace the present structure on Augustine Street now used to accommodate with a 240 student registration.

Building Plans Wait

No decision has yet been reached on the type of building to be constructed. No architect has yet been employed and no definite time has been set for probable occupancy of the new college.

Nazareth College has shown a remarkable growth since it was first opened in 1924 with a registration of 28 women. The first college courses were given in the "high house" on the Nazareth Academy campus in Lake Avenue.

Enlarged enrollment forced the moving of the college to its present location at No. 402 Augustine Street in 1928.

Plans for the coming term, starting September 13, is in progress at the college.

MANY HOME BENEFITS RESULT FROM NEW FLOOR COVERINGS

Old wood floors in kitchens and bathrooms that have become worn and splintered and show stains of grease and soap and medicines should be renewed or covered. The use of linoleum is the long and ready remedy for this is easily applied, makes a fine appearance, and takes little work to keep fresh and clean.

Before the linoleum can be laid the floors should be scraped to an even finish and all nails driven home or if any are loose they should be removed and replaced in a new spot so they will hold.

When the floor is smooth and level felt sheets are cemented to it. Over this the linoleum is laid and cemented.

Whenever possible the kitchen or bathroom fixtures should be lifted and set on top of the linoleum when it is laid. If this is not practical, the linoleum may be easily cut around them.

At the wall either a wood mold, or a metal one, should be fitted and set in place. This is the best of better yet, a brass cove made especially for this purpose can be inserted that makes a tight, neat joint that eliminates corners for dust to gather in.

The floors of other rooms may also be covered with linoleum, and the many designs now available make beautiful and appropriate floors for any room. They can be waxed and brought to a high polish that makes them very attractive and easy to clean.

New floor coverings of this kind can be financed under the Modernization Credit Plan of the Federal Housing Administration.

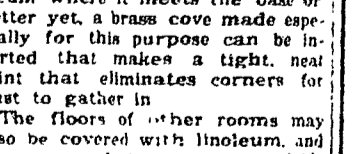
