EULOGY

Chasterton, the convert to Catholicism, was called by another convert from Protestantism and a friend.

This characterization of the late distinguished writer was given by the Rev. Ronald Knox, S. J., himself a noted author.

Father Knox declared that "the brilliance of Chasterton's work, the wideness of his appeal, set the fashion in favor of a religious attitude which the fashion of an earlier age had derided."

"He will almost certainly be remembered as a prophet, in an age of false prophets. He warned us, in spacious times, that human liberties were threatened, and today, human liberties are in debate."

Chasterton had the artist's eye, which could suddenly see, in some quite familiar object, a new value; he had the poet's intuition, which could suddenly detect, in the trite-out-of-phrases, a wealth of new meaning and of possibilities.

"That was what happened, when Chasterton was converted. He had looked for the thousandth time at the Catholic Faith, and for the first time he saw it.

Energy of will is the soul of every great character. Where it is there is resolute character; where it is not there is faintness, with attendant dependency, neglect of duty and failure.

THIRD WEEK IN JULY, 1936. Former Premier Lloyd George of England, speaking in the Catholic Street Welsh Baptist chapel in London this week on the condition of the workers, paid the following tribute to the Church.

It was the doctrine of the right of man, the quality of man, that was the test, and here I think it right to say in a Protestant church that the Catholic Church in the Middle Ages and the Dark Ages stood up for this principle and emancipated the whole of the earth in the country. We had slavery here and it was entirely through the action of the great leaders of Catholicism, under the influence of that church, that the emancipation came.
