Father Kunz Praised By Extension's Leader

This does the Most Rev. William D. O'Brien, D.D., President of the Catholic Church Extension Society of America and Auxiliary Bishop of Chicago characterize the late Rev. Francis X. Kunz, in a letter lauding Father Kunz and sent to his brother Charles A. Kunz, 178 Warner Street, Rochester.

"I have known Father Kunz for the last quarter of a century," Bishop O'Brien writes in commenting on Father Kunz's outstanding missionary endeavors.

"It was because of this that I invited him to be one of the officials of my Consecration Mass, which was only a small recompense to him for the wonderful way he has aided the work of the Church Extension Society all his priestly life."

Order of Martha First "I have known Father Kunz for the last quarter of a century," Bishop O'Brien writes in commenting on Father Kunz's outstanding missionary endeavors.

"Only last week as a memorial to Father Kunz, Household No. 118, Order of Martha, sent in an immense, large box of vestments and linens which are now being distributed to many missions. Our Director of the Order of Martha, the Rev. Richard B. St. John, who attended Father Kunz's funeral, has prepared an article on Father Kunz's missionary activities and it appears in the July number of Extension Magazine."

"I want you, Father Kunz's relations, his parishioners, and Household No. 118 of the Order of Martha, Rochester, N. Y., to know that had it not been for the fact that I had confirmation appointments which could not be postponed, I would have been my privilege to have represented the Extension Society at Father Kunz's funeral."

"Has Attained Reward" "Certainly, Father Kunz has attained his eternal reward. If what he had done for the Extension Society had been all that he had accomplished in his priestly life, outside of his splendid work as a curate and as a pastor, he would have attained a high place in heaven."

"As long as I live, and I know the other priests of the Extension Society, we will daily remember Father Kunz at the altar, although he, and anyone else who knew him, must realize that forever he is in the presence of Almighty God."

"Were he a member of a Religious Order which could carry on his cause through the years, I do not think he would have been remembered among the canonized saints of our Holy Mother Church."

"Expressing sympathy to the family, Bishop O'Brien declared it is known that Father Kunz is not only interesting before the Throne of God for his parishioners, friends and relations, but also for the work of the Catholic Church Extension Society."

REPORTS 31 RURAL SUMMER SCHOOLS HERE

More Than 1500 Children Get Religious Training In Rural Parishes

With 31 vacation schools in operation and more than 1500 in attendance, a diocesan-wide program in intensive religious training and distribution has been underway in the country districts of the Diocese of Rochester since July 6.

This report was released today by the Rev. Joseph H. Ball, Director, Rural Life Conference Bureau, Lima.

Much enthusiasm and keen interest has been aroused by all engaged in any way with this work, bringing to the underprivileged rural child the benefits of more complete Christian instruction.

Father Ball announced in issuing the report that the actual attendance in many places has surpassed the previously estimated attendance which in total was placed at 1500.

Father Ball stated that the intense heat, the zeal of pastors, teachers, parents and children has been undiminished.

Pointing out the many benefits accruing to rural children from this program, Father Ball declared that the greatest advantage is the opportunity of coming under the benign and inspiring influence of the sun.

Parents have expressed their gratitude and have shown themselves ready to make almost any sacrifice to have the children attend the vacation schools.

All of the vacation schools in the country districts but three are being conducted by nuns who are assisted by lay helpers of the parish.

The Sisters of St. Joseph, the Sisters of Mercy, and the Sisters of Charity are engaged in the work. Present indications point to a successful completion of the program.

Summer School To Emphasize New Music Series by Nun

Summer sessions of the Plus X schools here will be used to demonstrate the methods outlined in the series. Mother Stevens will be in Rochester, next month, will stress in Rochester part of the summer school here.

Book One, First Grade: Tone based on the major scale line, rhythm, the simplest forms based on time, creative use of tones.

Book Two, Second Grade: A continuation of the major line, free use of tone and rhythm; creative activity stressed.

Book Three, Third Grade, the minor line sight reading in the minor keys.

Book Four, Fourth Grade: Minor line continued, compound rhythmic figures.

Book Five, Fifth Grade: Study of progressing from key to key.

Book Six, Sixth Grade: Free modulation, major, minor, and chromatic lines.

Book Seven, Seventh Grade: Simple melodic lines two and three parts.

Book Eight, Eighth Grade: Part work continued. Choral work along two and three lines.

Beginning with the fourth grade Gregorian Chant is taught with this series, the Plain Song books (which were brought out some years ago for use in the Catholic schools in both England and Canada) by Father Justin Field O. P. a convert from the Episcopal Church will be used for the present with Mother Stevens' series.
