In it states that the word "sin" was addressed to President Roosevelt in Father Coughlin's Cleveland speech "in the heat of civic interest in the affairs of my country and in righteous anger at the developments that have contributed to what in the midst of plenty."
Father Coughlin states "For the record that my remarks and criticism delivered in Cleveland were directed at a candidate for the greatest political office within the gift of the people."
Usefulness as Citizen
In another statement, also made public this week, Father Coughlin said:
"My usefulness as an American citizen is an interwoven with the morality of my priesthood that should I become a disobedient and recalcitrant priest I would render myself entirely useless and all my preaching of Social Justice would be of no avail. Therefore whatever orders come forth from Rome curtailing my preaching Social Justice I will be only too happy to accede to the request and obey orders, I will always abide by the wishes of"

BISHOP WALSH NAMED HEAD OF MARYKNOLL

coast of South China, where St. Francis Xavier died in 1552.
18 Years On China Missions
Bishop Walsh attended the first General Council of the Church in China, held in 1924, and the first General Chapter of the Catholic Foreign Mission Society of America (Maryknoll) in 1929.
In his 18 years as a missionary in China, Bishop Walsh has had a spiritual charge of an area covering 20,000 square miles, approximately as large as West Virginia. The Catholic population in the area has shown a steady, sure increase from 6,333 to 8,658 during his eleven years as administrator. More than 4,000 baptisms have been registered in that time.
Bishop Walsh is a brother of Judge William C. Walsh of Cumberland, and of the Rev. John F. Walsh, also a Maryknoller, now stationed at the Maryknoll College, at Scranton after several years service in what is now Manchukuo.
Three sisters have entered religion: St. M. Rosalia of the Mission Helpers, Towson, Md.; St. M. Joseph of the Notre Dame Convent, Puerto de Tierra, Puerto Rico; and St. Marguerite, St. Joseph's College, Emmittsburg, Md. Other sisters are Mrs. F. L. Wynn of Baltimore and Miss M. G. Walsh of Cumberland.

Church Trustee Dies
Hornell funeral services for the late Thomas L. Tolan, retired mail carrier, and prominent in church and fraternal circles, who died last Saturday, were held Monday. There was a prayer service at the family home, 30 Erie Avenue, at 8 o'clock, followed by a Solemn High Mass at St. Ann's Church a half hour later. Interment was made in St. Ann's cemetery.
Mr. Tolan, who was 65 years old, had been in poor health for some time and for the past two weeks had been seriously ill.
Born November 4, 1871, in Hornell, Mr. Tolan had always resided here. He was well known and highly regarded. He entered the postal service August 1, 1900 and was retired September 1, 1924.
Mr. Tolan was a devout member of St. Ann's Church and for more than 35 years had served as a trustee. He was a member of the Holy Name Society and the Nocturnal Adoration Society. Mr. Tolan was also active in the Knights of Columbus and served three terms as grand knight of Hornell Council, 243. He was also a past district deputy. He was also a member of the Fourth Degree Assembly, Knights of Columbus and Alhambra Caravan of Buffalo.
He is survived by a daughter, Miss Helen Tolan, at home, and two brothers, John Tolan of this city and Mark Tolan of Washington, D. C.
