

Bishop Walsh attended the first
General Council of the Church in China, held in 1924, and the first General Chapter of the Catholic Foreign Mission Society of America (Maryknoll) in 1929.

In his 18 years as a missioner in China, Bishop Walsh has had spiritual charge of an area covering 20,000 square miles, approximately as large as West Virginia. The Catholic population in the area has shown a steady, sure increase from 6,333 to 8,635 during his eleven years as administrator. More than 5,000 baptisms have been registered in that time.

Bishop Walsh is a brother of Judge William C Walsh of Cumberland, and of the Rev. John F. Walsh, also a Maryknoller now stationed at the Maryknoll Col-lege, at Scranton after several years service in what is now Man-
