PARISH PLANS GALA BAZAAR FOR AUGUST

FR. CLUNEY LAID TO REST AT HONEOYE

Death of Priest at 73, Ends Long Career as Pastor, Civic Leader

Rochester and the Rev. Magr. Walter J. Lee of Geneva. Bearers were the Rev. Thomas F. Connors, Rochester; the Rev. William J. Killackey, Stanley; the Rev. Charles Mucile, Avon; the Rev. John Ball, Lima; the Rev. John Smith, Dansville; the Rev. Victor Hurley, Henrietta; the Rev. Stephen Byrne, Geneseo; and the Rev. Leo J. Donahue, Clifton. Burial was in St. Paul's Cemetery, Honeoye Falls.

Fr. Clune was born Jan. 1, 1863, in Lima, son of John and Joan O'Connell Clune. He attended St. Rose's School and St. Andrew's Seminary, Illinois, where attending St. Joseph's Theological Seminary in Troy caused him to leave but he afterwards completed his course at St. Mary's, Baltimore.

Active in Health Work
He was ordained to the priesthood in St. Patrick's Cathedral, this city, by the late Bishop Bernard J. McQuaid July 25, 1889. He went to Honeoye Falls in 1890 for a year as assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church, Rochester.

Fr. Clune besides his pastoral duties had many interests seeking to better the community in which he lived. He helped to establish the village library in 1919 and demonstrated his interest in health programs through participation in such organizations as the Tuberculosis and Health Association of Rochester and Monroe County. He was active in the erection of the Jesuit Mother St. Dana's Convent three years ago.

Fr. Clune leaves no immediate relatives. A cousin, Miss Margaret Carroll was his housekeeper for many years.
