Vast Assemblage Honor 'Father' Baker In Death

LACKAWANNA Thousands Always interested in helping the poor and unfortunate he revered St. Vincent de Paul as the patron saint of the poor. He was a member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. Joseph's Cathedral and visited the homes of those in need to give what assistance he could.

After spending a few years as a partner in the flour and grain business of Meyer and Baker, he decided to become a priest and entered Niagara University. He had received his elementary education in the public schools and studied religion and Latin with the Jesuit priests of St. Michael's Church, who later started Canisius College.

Earlier illness Passed Never strong physically, Father Baker was ill for several months and his Superiors were certain that he would never live to be ordained. But then, on several occasions since, his recovery was almost miraculous.

After his ordination on March 12, 1910, Father Baker came to St. John's Rectory, Lackawanna, as assistant to the Rev. Thomas F. Hines, founder of the institution. After several years work with the orphans and unfortunate boys, Father Baker was sent to Corning, but returned to Lackawanna in 1922 upon the retirement of Father Hines, and was placed in charge of the institution.

Monignor Baker had been in poor health for some time. His condition became critical several weeks ago. At his bedside when he died were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John J. Nash, Administrator of the Diocese of Buffalo for upwards of 33 years, and was a domestic prelate for more than a quarter of a century. Upon receiving word of the noted priest's death, Mayor George J. Zimmerman of Buffalo issued a proclamation ordering public mourning until the body of Father Baker shall have been received up to its last resting place.

USE HISTORIC SACRED VESSELS



These views, taken on the Feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, July 16, at the old Carmelite Monastery, near La Plata, Md., show the historic ciborium, chalice, paten and ostenorium used for Mass on that occasion, the first time used there since 1830, shortly before the nuns moved to Baltimore. The sacred vessels were brought to the United States from Antwerp, Belgium, by Rev. Charles Neale, S.J., brother of the second Archbishop of Baltimore, in 1760, when the Carmelite nuns arrived to found the first convent in the United States. The pupils write and speak English and are trained in kinds of work that will enable them to make their living on the water. French Prelates Give Norms For Catholics On Political Activity
Paris—(NC)—The assembly of Cardinals and Archbishops of France, which met recently at Paris, adopted resolutions concerning the attitude of the clergy, the Catholic laity and Catholic organizations toward political leagues and parties.
The resolutions, just made public, are as follows:
I—PARTIES
A. The clergy:
1. The clergy should not neglect their civic duties, but they should carefully avoid subservience to political parties.
2. They must expound, outside of any consideration of party, the Catholic doctrine concerning the rights of the Church, the family, the school and, in a general sense, the common good.
B. Catholics:
1. Catholics must be constantly careful to keep the Church and Catholic Action outside of and above parties.
2. The directors and militants of Catholic Action should not at the same time be directors, representatives or propagandists of a political party.
3. Catholics should practice especially the virtues of citizenship and especially respect for established authority.
C. Youth:
1. Adolescents and all young people lacking sufficient preparation, complete formation and experience of life should not engage prematurely in political affairs.
2. But by means of a serious religious, intellectual and economic training should prepare themselves progressively for the accomplishment of their civic duty.
