MEXICO HEADS AIM BLOW AT HIGHER STUDY

Closing of 'Privately-Directed Centers' Seen Intended

Mexico City. The National Superior Council on Education has given to the press the text of the study of the dispositions necessary to prevent the continued functioning of privately directed centers of higher education.

The Council is faced, the study states, with the grave problem of centers of higher education directed by individuals who, by the means, have already developed an offensive against the Constitutional articles of Article 4. These individuals, it adds, are reactionaries and the majority of them have clerical affiliations.

The Council has decided, therefore, to send out a questionnaire to the higher education throughout the Republic in order to determine whether the articles contained in the Project for the Regulation Article 4 of the Constitution are sufficient to solve the problem.

INVALIDS WILL ATTEND THE FIRST EUCHARIST DAY FOR SICK IN U. S.

MILWAUKEE, Wis. (N.C.)—This year the Eucharistic Day for the Sick, which will be held for the first time in the United States on August 26, at St. Sebastian's Church, here, will mark the tenth anniversary of the founding of the Apostolate of Suffering here in America.

This Pious Union for the Sick, which will celebrate the anniversary of 10 years' service for the spiritual welfare of the afflicted, by offering them an opportunity to attend divine services. Many invalids and shut-ins are joyful in the very anticipation of attending services, it is learned at the headquarters here. In many cases, they have not seen the inside of a church for as long as five, 10 and even 20 years, and never expected to attend Mass again.

The program of the day will open with a Solemn Pontifical Mass to be offered by the Most Rev. Aloisius J. Muench, Bishop of Fargo and Spiritual Director of the Apostolate. Bishop Muench was instrumental in the founding of the Apostolate when he was professor at St. Francis Seminary, St. Francis, Wis.

Dail Members Mourn Sir Osmond Esmonde

DUBLIN. The unexpected death of Sir Osmond Esmonde has caused sorrow in the Dail where he was a very popular figure. Sir Osmond was a member of one of the Free State's leading Catholic families and succeeded his father Sir Thomas Esmonde, twelfth Baronet, only last year on the Feast of the Assumption.

His family has been associated with County Wexford for over a thousand years and it is there that the family seat, Ballinacreeagh, is situated. Sir Osmond, the only titled member of the Dail, had represented County Wexford in the House since August, 1923. He was a member of the Fine Gael Party but often took an independent line of action in politics so that at one time his connection with his Party was severed, but at the last general election he rejoined the Dail.

Sir Osmond's father was married twice, his second wife who survives him, being an American. Sir Osmond was never married. Col. George Recker named Sudbury, Ont.—The Rev. Rosalind Legault, S.J., has been named Rector of Sacred Heart College here, succeeding the Rev. Louis Malhot, S.J., now Rector of St. Boniface College in Manitoba.

St. Francis Diocesan Priest Resigns to Enter Cistercian Order

SAN FRANCISCO (N.C.)—The Rev. Arthur O'Connell, pastor of St. Mary's Church, Oakland, has taken steps to join the Cistercian Order.

Having for a long time felt an attraction for the Religious life, he asked the Most Rev. John J. Mitty, Archbishop of San Francisco for a six-month period of absence from his parish for the purpose of entering a monastery to test his vocation. The leave was readily granted him, and shortly after Father O'Connell left St. Mary's, he went East and entered the Monastery of Our Lady of the Valley (Trappist) of the Cistercian Order, at Valley Falls, R. I.

Although his leave has not yet expired, he feels sure of the issue of his trial, and has definitely resigned the pastorate of St. Mary's.

Once Kian Center Now Church Site

ATLANTA GA. (N.C.)—The former "Imperial Palace" of the Ku Klux Klan, which once housed all the National Offices of the hooded anti-Catholic order, has been purchased by the Most Rev. Gerald P. O'Hara, Bishop of Savannah, for the new Catholic parish of Christ the King, it has been disclosed here.

After the Klan withdrew from the property the building was used as an apartment hotel. The two-story brick house will be razed and in its place a church will be erected. First services in the newly established parish have already been held on the property. The Rev. Joseph E. Moynihan, is pastor of the new church.

The property is located in an advantageous section of the city and is approximately 350 feet square.

Another priest, American, said his nephew, a Spaniard, was taken from a train near Madrid and shot to death. Others told of frequent shootings that have occurred in the streets of Madrid. Bands of Communists, they said, are executing all persons suspected of being in sympathy with the fascists or royalists.
