Reviews St. Joseph Parish's 100 Years

(Leading up to the Centenary of St. Joseph's Church, Franklin Street, Rochester, to be celebrated in October, a series of articles, several of which appear below, are being presented in the CATHOLIC COURIER from week to week. The following article relates to Father Prost, the first pastor taking charge.)

What rejoiced the heart of the new pastor was the complete harmony that existed among his flock and the esteem in which they held him. Despite the fact that there existed a system in those days that could be the source of bitter contention between a pastor and his people, Trusteism was introduced into the Church in the United States by Archbishop Carroll to harmonize the outward administration of church property with the democratic principles on which our Government is founded.

PRIEST APPOINTED TO FACULTY STAFF AT ST. BERNARD'S

The Rev. William F. Allen of the Diocese of Springfield, Mass., has joined the faculty of St. Bernard's Seminary. He is teaching Moral Theology, Canon Law and French in classes which began with the opening of the fall term. Catechetical and parish work in France and in this country are included in the preparation. Father Allen has made for teaching at the Rochester diocese's major Seminary. After attending St. Anselm's College preparatory school at Manchester, N. H., Father Allen made his philosophy at the House of Philosophy, Gerard Seminary, Montreal, conducted by the Sulpician Fathers. Going to France, he made four years of theology at Saint Sulpice Seminary, Paris, where he was awarded a Baccalaureate of Theology by the Catholic Institute of Paris. Following his ordination in Chicopee, Mass., July 6, 1931, Father Allen completed a year of parish work at St. Paul's Church, Chicopee, Mass. He went to Rome in 1932 and spent three years at the Institute of Civil and Canon Law, St. Apollinare, where he won a Doctorate in Canon Law, magna cum laude. For the past year, the new St. Bernard's Professor was engaged in parish work at St. Patrick's, Chicopee Falls and St. Mary's Church, North Hampton, Mass.
