ARCHBISHOP WILL PREACH AT CEMETERY

Priests, Seminarians, Knights to Take Part in Rites for Dead

The Most Rev. Archbishop Edward Mooney, Bishop of Rochester, will speak to those assembling for the annual Blessing of the Graves ceremony at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, Sunday afternoon, Sept. 20, beginning at 3:30 o'clock.

Escorted by the entire Rochester Regiment, Knights of St. John in command of Col. Frank H. Bie, supreme president of the order, the Archbishop and the ecclesiastical party will proceed from St. Bernard's Seminary at 3:15 o'clock to the Cemetery.

Going through the lanes of the Cemetery on both the east and the west side, the Archbishop will bless the graves with the faithful kneeling in silent prayer for the souls of the faithful departed.

Returning to All Souls' Chapel on the east side the Archbishop will speak from a specially constructed outdoor platform.

Priests in their purple robes and seminarians will take part in the services.

Announcement of the ceremony was made in the various churches in the Rochester diocese last Sunday.

Arrangements are being made to handle a large crowd.

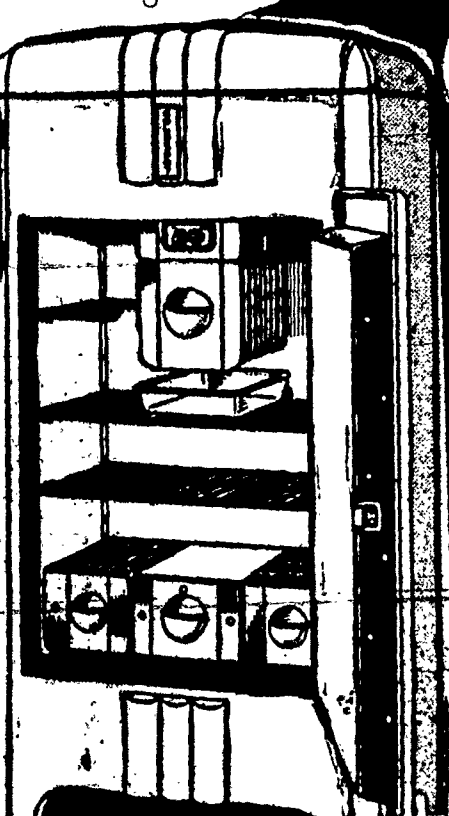

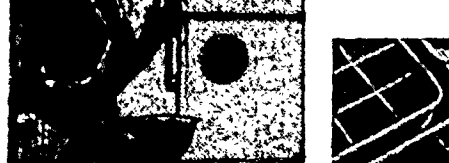

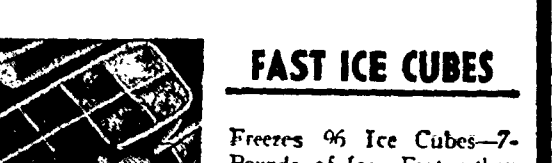
