

Catechetical Congress In New York Arranged

Every Diocese To Send Delegates To Convention of Christian Doctrine Confraternity; Held Here Last Year; Exhibits Planned

NEW YORK—With delegates expected from every diocese in the United States, plans are going forward rapidly for the Catechetical Congress October 3 to 6, at which will be discussed all phases of religious instruction. Sessions will be held at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel.

More than a score of Archbishops and Bishops have accepted invitations to speak on the program and will address the gathering, which will take place under the patronage of His Eminence Patrick Cardinal Hayes, Archbishop of New York. Last year the sessions were held in Rochester, N. Y., headed by the Rev. William R. Kelly, Superintendent of Schools in that city.

Among many projects to be discussed is a study of the Baltimore Catechism by theologians representing the ordinaries of 65 dioceses and the heads of 21 religious communities. For many months the text of this work, which has been a standard for the two generations that have elapsed since the last Baltimore Council, has been under close examination by this group of theological experts, and their criticisms and suggestions are to be considered with a view to possible revision.

Another part of the program will witness actual demonstrations by religious and lay leaders based on the Baltimore Catechism. The large enrollment of the Catholic High School, the underlying plan here, already in effect in some dioceses, calls for a religious school under diocesan jurisdiction in every parish which lacks a parish school or some formal religious instruction to all children.

Every branch of economic activity in Holland has its Catholic organization and each organization its trade organ. The abundance and variety of these indicates that the Catholic Action is a very powerful influence in the Netherlands.
