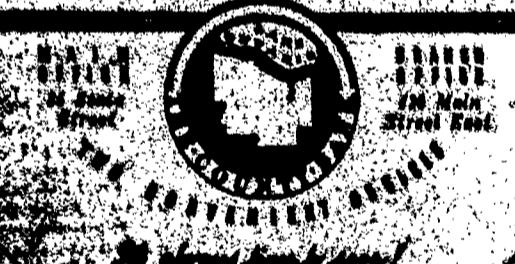

Auburn Catholics Meet To Begin Study Clubs

Discussion Study Work Outlined by Father Duffy at Preliminary Session; Catholic Centre Headquarters for Reference Works

The Rev. John M. Duffy was the guest speaker. On the first evening Father Duffy explained the meaning and the importance of Study Clubs, and traced in some detail the geographical background of the subject to be studied this fall.

On the following evening, Father Duffy, using the first issue in the "Life of Christ," the official outline book of the Study Clubs, showed how a meeting should be carried on.

The Catholic Centre located at 17 South Street is the official headquarters for all Study Club materials—Pamphlets, Testaments and Maps. Reference books may be used by members at any time. For the convenience of the Study Clubs the Centre is now open until 8:00 in the evening. Any clubs desiring to use the Centre for their meetings may do so on application.

PRIEST TO GIVE RADIO TALKS ON LIFE OF CHRIST

The Rev. Charles J. Mahoney, M.A., Associate Superintendent of Catholic Schools, Diocese of Rochester will be heard on the Rochester Catholic Hour in a series of talks to be given over Station WJAM beginning Sunday, Oct. 4 at 12:15 p. m.

The series inaugurating the new fall season of the Rochester Catholic Hour will be based on the life of Jesus. The talks by Father Mahoney will be of particular interest to study club members in the diocese who will commence discussion and study of "The Life of Jesus" the first week in October.

Material on the radio to follow step by step lessons for study will be supplementary to the work contained in the study club pamphlet as is the "reference reading" appearing in other columns of this issue of the CATHOLIC COURIER. "At this time when the faith is constantly called upon to defend the principles of the Church, the subject of Christ's life is most timely. It is pointed out by the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine sponsoring the study clubs: 'One cannot know the principles of Christ without knowing better his life and how he lived those principles.'"

Confraternity of Christian Doctrine Reference Reading for Study Club Members

THE LIFE OF JESUS LESSON 1

A series of eight articles, first of which is presented here, will be printed in the CATHOLIC COURIER to provide supplementary reading for members of diocesan study clubs now engaged in a consideration of "The Life of Jesus." It is suggested by leaders of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine that study club members slip these articles from week to week.

Political Condition "The Roman Empire was the assemblage under one sceptre of almost all the peoples of Europe, Asia, and Africa, the greatest conquering and organizing political power the world has ever seen."

"During four hundred years the authority of this Council had remained absolute. Herod was the first to sap its strength, but shrewd as he showed himself in usurping all other powers, he could not entirely cripple the Sanhedrin. That mighty assembly continued its sittings in the very face of the tyrant and survived his dynasty. For we see it, under the Romans asserting its right to settle all questions of doctrine to administer justice and to direct in secret the movements of the people. This, then, is the poor ghost of authority to which the power of Israel was finally reduced."

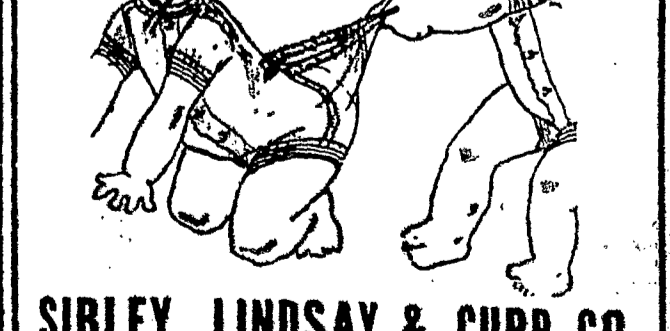
