Here they tied with strong ropes, by pairs, 20 Claretians in the presence of their captive confessor. As they were leaving the prison en route to the cemetery to be executed, one of the executioners said to the remaining Claretians: "Tomorrow will be your turn, now you have the whole day to amuse yourselves."

Other Martyrs Named
"To the above mentioned and already long lists of Claretian Missionary Martyrs should be added the names of the Superior of the Claretian Community at Barcelona, Father Gumeriada Vallterra, Father James Payas, a professor of the Claretian College at Salient, and Frater Adolph De Estaban, a Claretian student, who was murdered in Barcelona.

"In spite of the constant, uninterrupted watch to prevent the Claretian captives from going to Holy Communion, they were able to receive the Eucharist at least once every day. That they might not be deprived of this Heavenly Bread each of the Martyrs was provided with a number of consecrated hosts. At the time of Communion was brought to them with the portion of the daily bread which was delivered to them in the morning before breakfast.

"At 8 a. m. Thursday August 13, the two Argentinian Claretian students who had remained in prison until the execution of their confessor were set free."

RELIGION FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL YOUTH URGED AT N. Y. CONGRESS

Campion of Cathedral College here and Brother Victor of Manhattan College, this city.

The Most Rev. John Gregory Murray Archbishop of St. Paul, warned that the modern home must be reconstructed if society is to endure. He said that highly commercialized recreations were responsible for making the home today largely "a place to go only when one is tired."

Religious instruction at home for children was so vital, he asserted, that without it all other efforts by Church and school, supplemental efforts at best, would fail.

Adequate Catholic school facilities to take care of all Catholic children of school age were urged at one of the meetings by the Rev. Dr. George Johnson, Director of the Department of Education National Catholic Welfare Conference. Although Catholics have extended themselves to the utmost, both in finances and in personnel, they are only half-way on the road to the goal of adequate school facilities under Catholic auspices for every Catholic child, he said.

"The days are not long past," he continued, "when we had to defend the necessity of the Catholic school and to convince even our own people that secular education, plus a little religion, simply would not do."

Catholic School to Stay
"As Catholics," he said, "our mission is to go forth and teach all nations, which means that wherever there is a Catholic child we have an obligation towards him. Whatever may have been the case in the past, if for one an firmly convinced that as far as our people are concerned the Catholic school is here to stay."

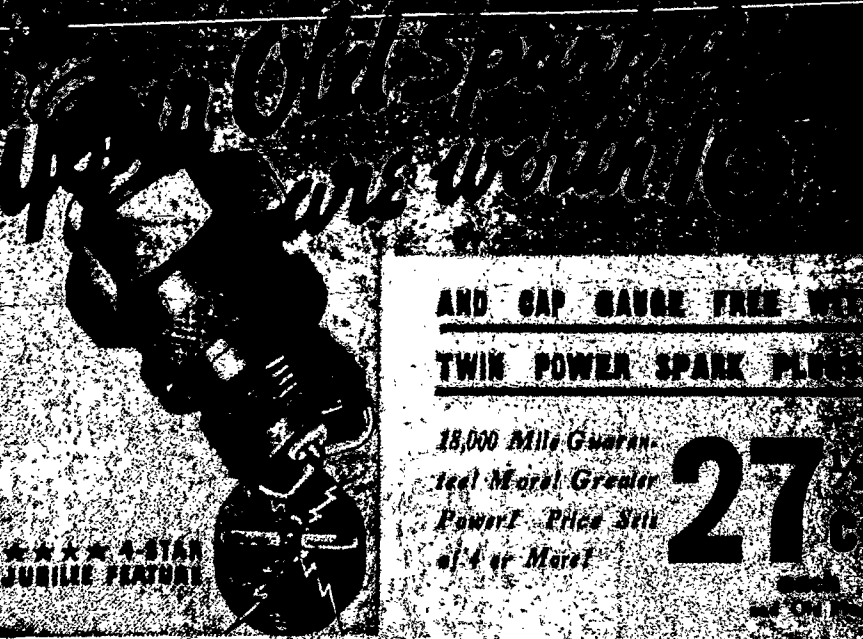
