Hero Sacrifices Son To Save Alcazar

By REV. EUGENE SUGRANES, C.M.F. WASHINGTON, (NC)—Chivalry and romance, loyalty and devotion, valor and bravery are not dead. They are still among us.

History has been repeating itself in these latter days. From the smoke and fire, from the wreck and ruin, from the horrors of despair and desolation of that 72-day siege of the Alcazar in Toledo, Spain, now comes the thrilling story of Colonel Jose Moscarda who courageously declined to yield the Alcazar to the Reds who held it as a hostage.

Colonel Moscarda's loyalty and devotion to duty seemingly outgrow the courage and valor of that master-man and man of mettle of legendary Spain, the celebrated Alonso Perez de Guzman, who resolutely refused to surrender the city of Tarifa to the enemies of the King and of his country, even under threat of losing his dearly beloved son.

According to a press dispatch Colonel Moscarda, leader of the defenders of the Alcazar, sacrificed his own son rather than surrender to the enemy the fortress confided to his defense. Radicals attacking Spain's West Point sent an ultimatum to Colonel Moscarda in forming him that his son was being held as a hostage and that he was to be slain unless the fortress were surrendered at once.

Refuses To Meet Demand Smothering his grief, the brave and heroic commander met the proposal with an obstinate refusal. To his son, in the hands of his enemies, he sent the following message: "These traitors have proposed that I save your life at the cost of the lives of my brave men and my honor. I hope you will die like a hero after praying loudly 'Long Live Spain!' Your life will then be eternal." His son heroically faced the firing squad.

This act of heroism and bravery reminds us of the famous siege of Tarifa near Gibraltar, Spain in 1293 under the King Sancho III. Bravo. Tarifa had been besieged by that King's rebellious and recreant brother, the Infante Don Perez de Guzman.
