Pope Honors Cardinal Dougherty's Former Bishop on Islands

VATICAN CITY (UPI)—Appointment of His Eminence Dennis Cardinal Dougherty, Archbishop of Philadelphia, as Legate of His Holiness Pope Pius XI to the Thirty-third International Eucharistic Congress, to be held at Manila, Philippine Islands, February 3-7, 1937, is announced officially this evening in Osservatore Romano.

When Cardinal Dougherty goes to Manila as Papal Legate to the Thirty-third International Eucharistic Congress next February, he will be returning to a territory in which he has already rendered brilliant service to the Church. There he has governed two Bishops.

For Communism is a universal threat not only to Catholicism but to Christian civilization the world over. It is not a mere political party. It is a religion, whose end is the State, whose cardinal virtue is hate, whose commandment is class warfare.

The revolt in Spain as pointed out by the priest-speaker has done two things: it has united in a common defense of Spanish traditions and institutions the parties of the Right and Center, and it has shown the world that the forces of the Right are not divided.

Communism unmasked Deplored the atrocities in Spain resulting from Communist control of government. Father Cirricione expressed the hope that the valiant parish who have been murdered for their Faith will not have died in vain.

I hope that the world will not ignore the sacrifice of their lives," he said. "They have torn off the hood of righteousness to reveal the diabolical design of its foul heart. They have presented to the world once more in the name of Spain and in the spirit of Columbus a great contribution."
