FORM GROUP OF NATIONAL SCIENCE BODY

High School Teachers Here Join Catholic Science Round Table

Organization of the first group of high school teachers in the Catholic Science Round Table took place Sunday with the formation here of a Rochester Chapter. Other groups in the national body are formed on the college level.

The group here composed of science teachers of Rochester, Auburn and Elmira heard the Rev. Francis P. LeBuffe, S. J., business manager of America discuss the feasibility of establishing a Rochester Chapter of the Catholic Science Round Table, Sunday.

He was presented to a group of science teachers of Catholic and secular high schools of the cities named by the Rev. John M. Duffy, Superintendent of Schools, under whose auspices the meeting was held.

The purpose of the High School is to get the Catholic teachers together to further a research attitude of mind and an advance study idea of mind.

The noted Jesuit described the Science Round Table "as a most informal and amorphous organization" with no officers but a secretary to announce meetings.

First meeting of the Rochester chapter will be held at the invitation of Nazareth Academy on April 24, 1937. Sister Martin Mara, S. J. of Nazareth Academy, was elected Secretary. At this first meeting Catholic Science teachers will report on the research work done during the coming period.

The national organization meets yearly in connection with the American Association for the Advancement of Science. Regional branches in New York, Boston, Buffalo and elsewhere hold bi-annual meetings in their respective localities.
