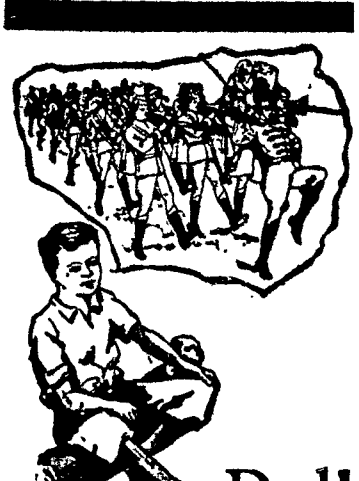

Advance of Missions Depends on Our Aid Declares Archbishop

Throng at Mission Sunday Rites in Cathedral Here Plea For Missions; Personal Observations Cited; Specific Aid Urged

Only through the sufferings of missionaries in the fields afar and the prayers and assistance of the faithful at home can Christ's kingdom be spread on earth, declared the Most Rev. Archbishop Edward Mooney, Bishop of Rochester at the Mission Sunday observance in Saint Patrick's Cathedral.

The Church, he said, is bound by the mandate of Christ, never to rest until the Gospel message is brought to every man, woman and child of each succeeding generation.

The Archbishop gave a definite impetus to active missionary zeal by pointing out the unusual presented to the Christian world today, that of bringing into the fold the sixty million untouchables of India who have recently renounced Hinduism.

Another project to stir missionary effort suggested by the Archbishop was the rebuilding of the mission of Shillong in India which was recently destroyed by fire.

Never a Complaint

Recounting his own experiences in the missions of India Archbishop Mooney said:

"I have seen men who have lived forty years in the jungle and have never heard them complain about any suffering they experienced. I have talked with the Sisters who worked among the lepers. The missionaries have but one serious complaint and that is that there are opportunities everywhere to spread the Faith but because of lack of means they could not take advantage of such opportunities to lay the foundation for the Christian Church."

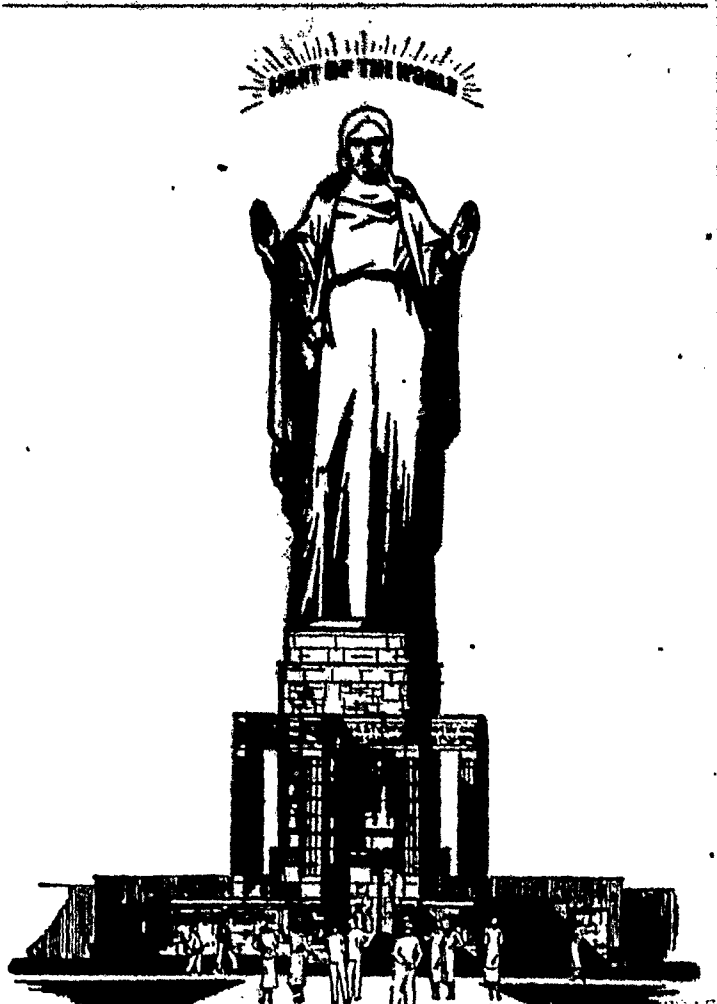

Prominent Americans Aid Bishop Noll In Anti-Communist Drive

Heroic Statue In Nation's Capital Aim of Movement Launched to Preserve Ethics and Principles of Christ in United States

FORT WAYNE, INDIANA. — There is a heroic monument to George Washington, Father of his country, a most artistic memorial to Lincoln, "Savior of our country." There are statues to our warriors, statesmen, our literary men and women, our great engineers.

The following have accepted Bishop Noll's invitation to aid in the committee and have accorded their cooperation to the statue project: Senator Carter Glass, of Virginia; Senator William E. Borah, of Idaho; Senator David I. Walsh, of Massachusetts; Governor Paul V. McNutt, of Indiana, and George N. Shuster, editor of The Commonwealth.

The assistance of government officials and the National Commission of Fine Arts in the work of selecting the best site for the monument in the national capital has been assured. Leading sculptors are being asked to submit designs for a colossal figure of the most artistic type to be had.

Bishop Noll is episcopal chairman of Catholic lay organizations in the United States. United action by these bodies is expected to result in the most universal anti-Communist campaign thus far launched in this country.

In a recent interview with the International News Service, Bishop Noll said:

"It must be evident to all that recent horrors in Spain clearly show the frightful results of Communist projects."

"American intelligence cannot ignore the fact that our religious liberties are menaced, our business and commercial future jeopardized, and our heritage of liberty is being taken away from us by a people already under the shadow."

"It is folly for us not to realize that Communism is being openly taught in many universities and schools of our own country. Not only that, but schools established for the sole purpose of spreading Communist propaganda are springing up all over the United States."

"It is generally conceded that the Catholic Church is a powerful bulwark against the enemies of duty, constituted government and the liberties of human beings. How, then, can we fight against Communism in our United States must be carried on by Catholics, Protestants and all adherents of religion in any form. Communism is no respecter of creeds in its horrible warfare on God."

"The status of Christ which we intend to erect in the city of Washington is to be symbolic of the desire of all Americans to continue to live within the principles and ethics of Christ who, apart from his divinity, was the world's greatest teacher of righteous relations among men."

"First as a Catholic bishop and secondarily as publisher of the world's leading popular Catholic weekly, I see in this fight the necessity of national Christian action against the almost world-wide tide of Communism which seems to be sweeping towards us. As always in history, the conflict is such that we of the clergy must lead. The lay will surely follow. A constant reminder.

"We are yet, thank God, in a sense a Christian nation. In order to remain we must strive to keep before the American people the ideals proclaimed by our Holy Redeemer. We must in some impressive manner continue to remind Americans that only by following the teachings of Christ can our glorious civilization be maintained."
