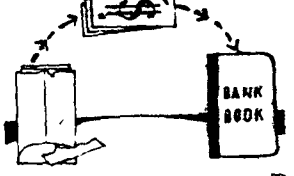

MARGARET HAUGHERY Margaret Haughery, known as "the mother of the orphan," was one of America's greatest women.

She came to this country with her parents when she was a baby. Her parents died in Baltimore and she was taken in by a neighbor family. When she was 21 years old she married Charles Haughery and went with her husband to New Orleans. Her husband and her infant child died the following year.

With Sister Francis Regis she raised funds for the building of St. Teresa's Church. She established a dairy farm and drove about the city delivering milk. She later opened a bakery, the first steam bakery in the South, and for years continued her rounds in the bread cart.
