




Catholics In History MARGARET HAUGHERY

Margaret Haughery, known as "the mother of the orphans," was one of America's greatest women. Left an orphan when she was eight years old and owing her upbringing to charitable neighbors, she herself devoted her life to defatigable energy, her great or-sanising ability, and her devotion to the afflicted and the poor.

She came to this country with her parents when she was a baby. Her parents died in Baltimoro and she was taken in by a neighbor family. When she was 21 years old she married Charles Haughary and went with her husband to New Orleans. Her husband and her infant child died the following year.

Bhe obtained employment in an orphan asylum and often when the orphans were without food she ob-tained it for them with her own earnings. Through her efforts the Female Orphan Asylum of the Bisters of Charity was relieved of bur-densome debt. During the epidemic of yellow fever she went from house to house nursing the sick and consoling dying mothers with the assurance that their children

should be cared for. With Sister Francis Regis she raised funds for the building of St. Teress's Church. She established a dairy farm and drove about the city delivering milk. She later opened a bakery, the first steam bakery in the South, and for years continued her rounds in the bread cart. During the Civil War she went through the lines of the opposing armies on her missions of charity. Her wisdom and practical ability caused people in all walks of life to seek her solvice. A menument in her honor stands in New

Orleans in a little park named after her, Margaret Place. She was sorn in Cavan, Ireland, in 1814, and died at New Orleans in 1982. (N.C.W.C. FEATURES)
