Author Urges New Catholic Theater Movement

'First Legion' Playwright Sees Aid to Catholic Life and Good Drama Parish Groups Project Should Center On Individual Efforts, Lavery Claims

LOS ANGELES, Calif. (Special to Catholic Courier)—The author of a national Catholic theater to project the Catholic way of life and preserve good drama generally was proposed this week to the Catholic Women's Club of Los Angeles by Emmet Lavery, author of "The First Legion" drama on the Jesuits, which has been translated in seven languages and produced on both sides of the Atlantic...

Theater in Every Parish "The plan requires no subsidy no foundation," Mr. Lavery pointed out. "It requires merely a national consciousness in the theater, a common purpose and a common sense of standards. I have in mind a Catholic theater in every parish auditorium where there are a few souls with imagination..."

Questions Movie Influence "If we take the Catholic Literary Review to heart and really believe that Catholicism is a culture to be expressed a life to be lived, as well as a creed to be professed," Mr. Lavery went on, "the question naturally comes up as to what we are doing to make the Catholic way of life a little richer and more widely enjoyed..."

Communists Ahead Mr. Lavery then readily admitted that the natural set-up of present production is such a possibility. "I think we have done well to make such strides in pictures," he said, "but I think this is an accomplishment that does not exist in any instance of advanced Catholic culture. For that, I am convinced we must turn back to the theater and only to discover that the Communists, who also have a culture to protect, have gone ahead of us..."

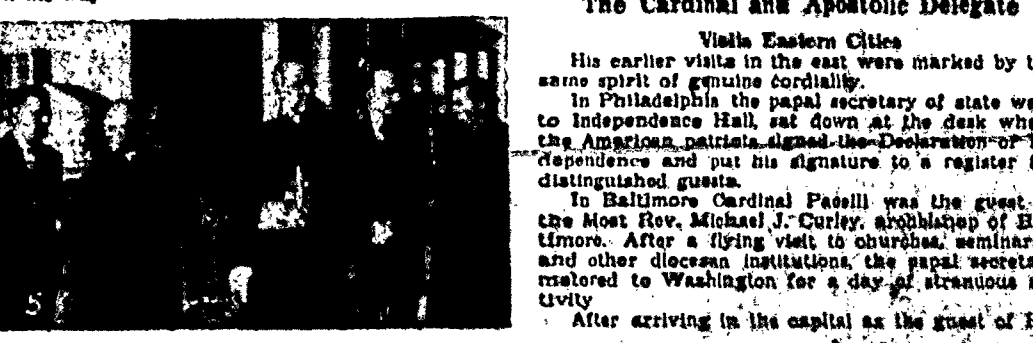
