## TRADE BODY SPURNS AID TO SPAIN REDS

**MONTECAL**—The Trades and Labor Council of Montreal has gone on record by a vote of 49 to 10 as opposing any aid to the communists of Spain.

In the executive committee's report for discussion, the main item referred to a Toronto communication asking that a sum of money be voted for the Spanish Government. The Toronto letter gave as reason for this contribution that the Spanish Government was "fighting for the liberty and general interests of democracy."

The local executive committee recommended that the request be ignored. A vote upheld this recommendation.

## Bishop Helps Win Hostages' Release

**PARIS** (NC)—Following joint action of the Most Rev. Clement Mathieu, Bishop of Aix, and M. Janod, International Red Cross delegate, the women and children held as hostages at Bilbao by Spanish Reds, have been liberated.

Their liberation was ordered by the new head of the Basque State, Aguirre. After the order had been given, the hostages were taken by night to the coast of Portugal, where they boarded two British destroyers, Exmouth and Fah. These ships took them to St. Jean de Luz and from there they reached San Sebastian.

An enthusiastic welcome awaited the hostages at San Sebastian but unfortunately, they were the bearers of sad tidings to some of those who were on hand to greet them and there were many tears amid the general joy.

**RETURN TO CONGO**  
New York—The Rev. John E. Burke, C. S. P., new pastor of the Church of St. Paul the Apostle, mother church of the Congregation of St. Paul, has taken up his duties in that post.

## MINE WORKERS LAUD COOPERATIVE HEADS

**W. L. HAY** N. S. N. C.—When a sub-committee of the United Mine Workers met here to prepare plans for the annual district convention at Truro one delegate expressed the invitation to the Rev. M. M. Condy and Professor A. B. MacDonald of St. Francis Xavier University Extension Department, to be speakers on the ground that these two leaders of the New Social movement were only setting up machinery for Fascism in order to hold on to the capitalistic system.

The protest was quickly answered and found no support. Arthur Petrus, convention chairman said:

It is unfortunate there are not more men of the type of Dr. Condy and Professor MacDonald in Nova Scotia. They are not going around asking men to tear down and destroy by revolution but are urging the people to work and take enough interest in their own affairs. Other speakers joined in praising the work of the two cooperative leaders.

As a mark of this appreciation the committee approved an invitation to Dr. Condy and Professor MacDonald to speak at the convention. John L. Lewis, president of the International Union of Mine Workers will also speak.
