PASTOR LAUDS KNIGHTS AT CHAPTER MEET

Seneca Falls Sessions Draw 125 Delegates From Central Councils

Seneca Falls—More than 125 delegates of Knights of Columbus Councils in Central New York assembled here Sunday for the quarterly meeting of the Central Chapter held in the K. of C. rooms.

Father Quitt expressed agreement over the number of knights attending the meeting and complimented them on their keen knowledge of present conditions and their clear manner of expressing themselves in making solutions for many problems now confronting organized Catholic laymen.

Catholic activity as urged by the Supreme Council was given a major portion of the sessions. Chairman Philip H. Donnelly of the Catholic Activities Committee, Rochester Council, outlined the Catholic action program of the Rochester Knights and emphasized the importance attached to study of the church's principles as a spur to subversive forces such as Communism.

An excellent report on the Columbian Squires movement which is the junior organization of the Knights of Columbus was given by Franklin Fennell of Rochester. He urged the advancement of Columbian Squires to assure continued and healthful growth of the Knights of Columbus.

Chairman of the Chapter, John J. Leas of Geneva, presided at the sessions. Grand Knight William H. O'Brien of Seneca Falls Council welcomed the delegates.

A dinner in the Rathskeller followed the business sessions. Seneca Falls was chosen for the January meeting of the Chapter.

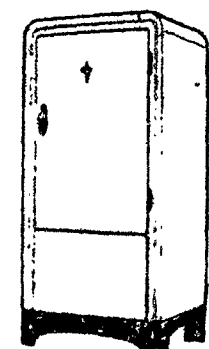
