ROB FACTORY Pittsburgh - Brandishing pistols three men pushed their way into the rectory of St. Adalbert's Church here Tuesday and, taking up the pastor, his two assistant priests, the housekeeper and two visitors, escaped with two watches and \$88 in cash.

CONDUCTS K. C. FORUM Washington - Under the auspices of the Washington General Assembly of the Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus the Rev. Aloysius J. Hogan, S. CONVENT 100 YEARS OLD Dublin - The centenary of St. Catherine's Dominican Convent, Slon Hill, Blackrock, County Dublin, was recently celebrated with a solemn Mass in the church at which the Most Rev. Edward G. Byrne, Archbishop of Dublin, presided. Also present was the Most Rev. Francis Wall, Bishop of Thasos.

MARTYR'S ANNIVERSARY Montreal - Historic Notre Dame Church here was the scene of an impressive service to mark the fifteenth anniversary of the Blessed Martyrs of Uganda as well as the pending return to their stations in Africa of the Most Rev. Edouard Michael, Vicar Apostolic of Uganda, and the Most Rev. Oscar Julien Vicar Apostolic of Nyasa.

TWO (LERY) FREED Amsterdam - Release from prison in Nazi Germany of two members of the Pious Society of the Missions (Pallotine Fathers), who were sentenced to serve three years for alleged violation of the Reich's currency regulations. The two, the Rev. John Steiwert, P.S.M., and Brother Lorenz, P.S.M., were reported here to have been freed after having served eight months in prison.

DENTAL DEAN HONORED Chicago - Dr. C. N. Johnson, dean of students and professor of Operative Dentistry at Loyola University School of Dentistry here, was elected to the Academy of Dentistry of Toronto, which met in that city. He was awarded a life membership in the Academy, an honor bestowed on only four other men.

CARDINAL TO DEDICATE New York - Fordham University's new Graduate School building, Kesting Hall, completed recently at a cost of \$1,000,000, will be formally dedicated December 6. His Eminence Patrick Cardinal Hayes, Archbishop of New York, will officiate at the ceremonies. The three-story building is of modified English Gothic design. It covers half an acre.

HONORS ORGANIZER Paris - Abbe Bergery, pastor of the Grondin parish of St. Emilion, who was one of the best orators in the French Parliament but is even better known now as the organizer of the international pilgrimages of war veterans to Lourdes, will be addressed hereafter as Canon Bergery. The Most Rev. Maurice Felin, the new Bishop of Bordeaux, has conferred upon him the title of honorary canon of his Cathedral.

POPE LAIDS BOOK New York - "The Question Book" apologetic volume by the Rev. Bertrand L. Conway, C.S.P., is highly praised by the Holy Father, according to a statement from His Eminence Eugenio Cardinal Pacelli, Papal Secretary of State, sent to Father Conway. A specially bound copy of the book was presented to the Holy Father by the author.

Hit Editorial Attack Upon Fr. Coughlin

Reader Challenges Democrat and Chronicle Stand On Retirement

An editorial in the Sunday Democrat & Chronicle, branding the radio retirement of the Rev. Charles E. Coughlin as "logical, welcome and wholesome" was challenged from many quarters this week.

Whether or not one agreed with the platform performance of Father Coughlin during the campaign, the requiem pronounced over his speaking career by the Democrat & Chronicle in last Sunday's issue cannot pass unchallenged.

Opposed Fr. Coughlin With the defeat of their candidate and the re-election of President Roosevelt apparently still ranking in their minds, the Democrat and Chronicle editors like their journalistic brethren in error seem to be casting around for a sally and looking upon Father Coughlin as a likely recipient of the blame.

I wonder if these same editors consider that their editorial railings against the president might also have turned the greater number of their readers to his support. That's what the results seem to indicate.

During the campaign, I opposed many of Father Coughlin's ideas. I considered his personal attacks on the president ill-considered. I think he came to the same conclusion after sobor afterwards for public apologies followed.

Statement Is Incorrect The editorial encompasses the entire career of Father Coughlin, public career as starting with "incoherent and ill-considered agitation" and ending with "sheer ranting and personal abuse."

Father Burns Escapes While Captors Battle

Missionary's Nine Months' Imprisonment Ends As Bandits Who Held Him For Ransom Clash With Japanese in Manchurian Wilderness

MUKDEN, MANCHUKUO—While the Chinese bandits who held him captive for nine months battled Japanese troops, the Rev. Joseph Clarence Burns, Maryknoll missionary, made good his escape, according to word received by the United States Consul General here.

First word of Father Burns' capture by bandits reached this country through the State Department from the American Consul General at Mukden the early part of February. The advice stated that the priest was abducted from his mission by a group of six brigands on February 5.

VATICAN CITY—Receiving the members of Bureau International Catholique Radiophonie in audience on Tuesday His Holiness Pope Pius XI remarked upon the singular importance of the occasion, saying it was the first time that a group of Catholic exponents of broadcast radio had been received by the Holy Father.

PLAN TO STRESS CATHOLIC STAND ON SCHOOL AND

WASHINGTON - (NC) - Constant efforts to enlighten the public on the Catholic attitude concerning state-aid of schools, was pledged by members of the Department of Superintendents of the National Catholic Educational Association in a resolution adopted at the nineteenth semi-annual meeting of the department held at the Catholic University of America here.

The resolution declares that the country's citizens have seemed to miss the distinction between "public" and "school aid" in the matter of finance which the children attending Catholic schools are concerned, although transportation in some states and textbooks and welfare funds in others have been provided for years.
