Msgr. Corrigan Explains Aims and Accomplishments of School

WASHINGTON The aims and accomplishments of the Catholic University of America were described Sunday over the Columbia Broadcasting System by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph M. Corrigan, rector.

The national broadcast was held in anticipation of Catholic Day November 29. Msgr. Corrigan recalled the early days of the university and its progress since then, asserting that while many changes have occurred the purpose of the institution has not.
