## THE MARCH of EVENTS

### in the Rochester Diocese

#### A Chronology

Presenting the outstanding events in the Diocese of Rochester from the issuance of the Fall Review and Annual Calendar, August, 1935, through September, 1936, as gathered from the pages of The Catholic Courier.

October, 1935—Two Rochester men, Francis A. O'Brien and Harold E. Cowley, were raised to full professorships at Rochester Division, Niagara University.

October, 1935—Aquinas Institute Dramatic Club presented "The First Lesson" by Eugene Lyons.

October, 1935—A new memorial surrounded by a bronze cross, gift of Herman G. Heister, was dedicated on the grounds of Mercy High School. The new marks the building of the new cabinet shop "for Christ" by three Franciscans in 1858.

October, 1935—The Rev. Dr. Edward J. Conroy, Rector, St. Alexander's, and the Rev. Fr. Frank O.P.M., of the World War Veterans, met at Holy

Catholic University of America, principal speaker.

October, 1935—Annual campaign of Aquinas Institute closed with a total of \$74,608.18 pledged in cash and pledges.

October, 1935—"Rural Life and Christian Doctrine," was topic of a nation-wide radio address given by the Most Rev. Archbishop Edward Mooney, Bishop of Rochester, speaking in the Columbia Broadcasting System's "Church of the Air" period originating at Station WHEC.

October, 1935—Funeral services held for George T. Roche, prominent layman, Knight of Columbus and Boy Scout official at Our Lady of Lourdes church.

October, 1935—A new study club movement on the missions, in which each home room was to act as a club and meet monthly was announced by the Rev. John O'Donnell, moderator of the Aquinas Institute Mission Unit.

October, 1935—St. Dominic's parish comprising Catholics of Manchester and Shortsville, celebrated the fiftieth anniversary of dedication of its first church. The Rev. John Napier, pastor, was in charge during fifty years the parish grew from twenty to three hundred families.

October, 1935—A solemn High Mass marked the dedication of a flag pole and American flag in the
