January, 1936—The CATHOLIC COURIER issued an extra edition Jan. 18, giving the church's views on birth control, in answer to Mrs. Hepburn's talk before the Chamber of Commerce.

January, 1936—The St. Gerard Maternity Guild, considered an antidote to the Birth Control Clinic, met January 29, for election of officers.

January, 1936—Mrs. Hepburn, nationally known birth control advocate, failed to answer statements and charges made by the CATHOLIC COURIER following her address in Rochester.

January, 1936—Mrs. Rose Croston was elected President of the Rochester Advisory Senate, Ladies Catholic Benevolent Association at the Annual Banquet meeting held at Columbus Civic Centre.

January, 1936—The arrival Feb. 1 of Miss Miriam Marks, Executive Secretary, National Center of the Comfraternity of Christian Doctrine, from Washington, marked the beginning of the Study Club movement in Rochester.

January, 1936—Holy Name Society of St. Mary's Church, Auburn, passed resolutions condemning the proposed Child Labor Amendment and supporting the Moran bus bill.

February, 1936—The CATHOLIC COURIER opened its drive for 10,000 new subscriptions with a rally at the Columbus Civic Centre.

February, 1936—The Little Flower Study Group of St. Joseph's Church sponsored a movement to erect a shrine of the Little Flower in the Church as a memorial to the late Rev. William Brick, CSS.R.

February, 1936—Rev. Michael B. Groden, pastor of St. Vincent de Paul's Church, Corning and Joseph J. Doran, assistant United States Attorney, were principal speakers at the Holy Name Banquet of Blessed Sacrament Church.

February, 1936—The prizes for the most CATHOLIC COURIER subscriptions in the 1st and 2nd reports, were won by John Stadtmiller of Holy Family School, and Jessie Butler of Our Lady of Good Counsel School.

February, 1936—A forward movement was launched by four councils of the Knights of Columbus which convened at the Columbus Civic Centre. Supreme Special Agent John F. Duffey of Boston brought the message from the National headquarters.
