July, 1936—Nazareth College purchased a new tract of land in Pittsford for the college building.

July, 1936—Grand Knight Arthur Simonelli and his relatives were honored at the annual meeting of the Holy Name Society, Corning.

July, 1936—More than 1,000 attended the solemn blessing of the four new memorial bells for St. Mary's Church, Canandaigua, by the Most Rev. Archbishop Edward Mooney, Bishop of Rochester.

July, 1936—Enroute to Rome for an official audience with the Holy Father, the Most Rev. J. H. Schlarman, D.D., Bishop of Peoria, Ill., visited the Elmira Reformatory.

July, 1936—Leo V. Schosger was elected Grand Knight of the Cornring Council, Knights of Columbus.
