crimes committed on so vast a scale and of such peculiar horror as to make us doubt whether it is not our manifest duty to endeavor at least to show our disapproval of the deed and our sympathy with those who have suffered by it."

Dangers of the racket and racketeers of education—dangers which are "very serious and imminent for the home, for our youth, for our country and for our religion," were scored by the Most Rev. John T. McNicholas, O.P., Archbishop of Cincinnati who expressed the hope that the American public will awaken to such dangers.

Persecution of religion in Mexico and dissemination of propaganda of the revolutionary government in the United States were denounced in resolutions adopted at the closing session of the fifteenth annual convention, National Council of Catholic Women held at Fort Wayne, Ind.

The Most Rev. Francisco Orozco y Jimenes, Archbishop of Guadalajara, colorful figure in Mexican affairs was promised guarantees of personal freedom asked for by his Coadjutor, the Most Rev. Garibi Rivera in a letter to President Cardenas. The promise was made in a reply signed by Luis Rodriguez, private secretary to the president and addressed to Archbishop Orozco.

Spiking rumors, water of the Grotto of Lourdes was declared absolutely pure following a double investigation made by the departmental director of hygiene for the Hautes-Pyrenees, Dr. Carrere and by Prof. Tanon of the Academy of Medicine, Chief of the Services of Hygiene who went from Paris to Lourdes to make his investigation.

The Rev. Charles E. Coughlin, founder of the the National Union for Social Justice declared that the United States made a semi-secret pact with the League of Nations in 1933 to support sanctions and asserted that "these days are more perilous for America than you may suspect," in his regular Sunday afternoon broadcast.

DECEMBER, 1935

Fines totaling at least \$2,000,000 had been imposed so far on defendants in many trials instituted against Catholic religious orders and societies in Germany, reliable estimates in Amsterdam showed. Fines were seen greatly out of proportion with the infractions against foreign exchange regulations the religious were accused of by Nazi authorities. Particularly was this so when it was remembered that proceeds of the loans contracted abroad by various Orders, whose repayment eventually caused them to be involved were principally needed for charitable institutions, old age homes, children's infirmaries and the like.

Returned from an extensive tour of Mexico, the Rev. Alcuin Heibel, O.S.B., professor of history at Mt. Angel College declared that there is no religious nor political freedom in that country.

Announcement was made that national classification of motion pictures was to come from the center of distribution, New York City.

"Measured, deliberate and emphatic condemnation" for those persons who at a meeting in Carnegie Hall advocated birth control for families on relief was voiced by His Eminence Patrick Cardinal Hayes in a vigorous sermon delivered from the pulpit of St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York.

Elevating 20 prelates to the Cardinalate at one time His Holiness Pope Pius XI held a Consistory at the Vatican that was not only the most notable of His Pontificate but in the entire history of the Church. His Holiness expressed his ardent desire for "peace consistent with justice, truth and charity for all," in a profound allocution at the Secret Consistory.

Determined to put across legislation relaxing the restrictions imposed upon the dissemination of contraceptive information, the National Committee on Federal Legislation for Birth Control inaugurated its usual pro-Congress publicity drive.

Request that the United States Government remonstrate against the persecution of religion in Mexico was renewed by the Supreme Board of the Knights of Columbus in a letter sent to President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

With the purpose of affording Mexican parents specific enlightenment on the subject of their arduous but inescapable task with respect to the education of their children, the Mexican Hierarchy issued a Joint Pastoral on "The Educative Doctrine of the Church."

Ban on the singing of Handel's "Messiah" in the auditorium of the Washington Junior High School, Mount Vernon, N. Y. was rescinded by the Mount Vernon Board of Education. The ban which brought many protests was placed on the singing of the "Messiah" because the Board declared it "sectarian." An opinion from the State Department caused the Board to reverse its decision.

Criticism of thirteen non-Catholic clergymen of Cardinal Hayes condemning those who advocated birth control for families on relief drew a vigorous clear and measured rebuke from the Cardinal. An Episcopalian clergyman, the Rev. John Cole McKim of Peekskill, N. Y., also assailed the critics of the Cardinal.

On the eve of Christmas, the great feast of peace, His Holiness Pope Pius XI made a world pronouncement. In it note was taken of the rising tide of paganism in various lands, much of it directed against the priesthood. The Holy Father spoke of hopes he had entertained for peace of the world, but which unfortunately had been unfulfilled, and insisted that He, as the Father of Christendom, does not and cannot lose those hopes, because "hope is the real duty of Christian life," and announced the publication of an Encyclical on Christian Priesthood.

JANUARY, 1936
