Pope Opens Press Exhibit



His Holiness, Pope Pius XI, in the midst of a strenuous year at the Vatican, opened the World Catholic Press Exhibit at an impressive ceremonial Catholic periodicals from all parts of the world including the CATHOLIC COURIER, formed a part of the exhibit.

and religious Orders spending Christmas in jail, the Catholic Church in Germany approached the new year with the most serious apprehensions felt since the advent of political power of the Hitler regime. Kulturkampf in the open seemed certain to become the connotation of the new phase of Nazi paganism in the coming year. Both the Hierarchy and the faithful were prepared for it.

Two schools of thought developed following disclosure that a group of 20 Protestant Episcopalians, 20 of them clergymen had addressed to all their bishops in this country, and to more than 1000 of their ministers an urgent appeal for reunion with the Roman Catholic Church. Some Protestant Episcopal clergymen flatly rejected such a proposal, others said they saw something of merit in it.

The Rev. Charles F. Coughlin, founder of the National Union for Social Justice announced plans in Detroit for publication of a national weekly newspaper.

Intensity of attacks on things Catholic in Germany was indicated by the suppression of the famous Jesuit monthly, Stimmen der Zeit, published in Freiburg and edited in Munich, for a period of four months by order of political police.

Uneasiness in Washington was occasioned by reports that Communist base of operations in the western hemisphere had been shifted from Uruguay to Mexico City.

A hostile reception was accorded Mrs. Margaret Sanger, American birth control advocate, when she spoke in Albert Hall, Calcutta, India in favor of the cause she espouses. A barrage of questions forced her to admit that there are evils as well as benefits from birth control.

FEBRUARY, 1936

On the occasion of His Holiness, Pope Pius XI's beginning of the fifteenth year of His Pontificate, the Most Rev. Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Apostolic Delegate to the United States reviewed the great services the Holy Father has rendered the Church and urged all the faithful to co-operate in the mission of sanctification to which the Pope has called all.

Priests should not be excluded from expressing an honest point of view from the moral standpoint during an election campaign, His Eminence Rodrigue Cardinal Villeneuve, Archbishop of Quebec declared in a pastoral letter.

Mortal remains of Father Damien, Apostle to the lepers, were brought to the United States and lay for a time before the high altar of St. Mary's Cathedral, San Francisco for veneration of assembled throngs.

Citing numerous instances of unrelenting persecution, a letter was sent by the Mexican Hierarchy to the Bishops of the United States, England, Spain, Latin America and the Philippines, appealing for prayers for the relief of the persecuted Catholics of their unhappy country.

Integral Catholicism, the complete and wholly consistent practice of the Faith in dealings with all men without exception was proposed by the Rt. Rev. Magr. Joseph M. Corrigan, Rector of St. Charles Borromeo Seminary, Overbrook, Pa., at the meeting of the Conference Committee on Negro Welfare in Philadelphia as the only possible program for Catholics to endorse in the relations between the white and colored races.

Brutal violence marked the attempt by Nazi authorities in Germany to crush the valiant champions of religious freedom, the Catholic Youth Groups. Leaders were unjustly accused of Communist leanings and arrests followed.

Elections in Spain did not result in victory for any particular group but turned out badly for the entire nation. Observators Romano declared in commenting upon the elections. The Vatican organ touched upon the statement of Gil Robles that the Leftist victory was due to a concurrence of subversive elements and an unexpected alliance of many persons discontented with present conditions.

Necessity of religious education in character training was emphasized on the floor of the United State Senate by Senator David I. Walsh of Massachusetts and Senator Royal S. Copeland of New York when the latter introduced a bill for the appointment of a Joint Committee on Education, Welfare and Law.

MARCH, 1936

Censorship through legislative measures was warned against and assurance given that the Legion of Decency will continue vigilant and will urge the maintenance of an active interest in the moral significance of motion pictures in a statement issued by the Bishops' Committee on Motion Pictures.

For the "fippant manner" in which Judge Stanley Struble of Cincinnati lectured a defendant, who was one of 15 children, whose wife was one of 14 children, and who was the father of three children in four years of married life, the Rt. Rev. Magr. Frank A. Thill, Chancellor of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati severely arraigned the judge in a letter sent to all pastors. The Judge, Monsignor Thill declared must have "disgusted every informed Christian and every lover of economic justice in this community."

Organization of Catholic Action in Lithuania to correspond as far as possible to the organization of the National Catholic Welfare Conference in the United States was to be recommended by the Most Rev. Theophil Matulis, Apostolic Administrator of Leningrad, upon his return to Lithuania, he announced in Washington before leaving.

Before a State teachers' meeting in Guadalajara, President Cardenas of Mexico said: "The Government will not incur the error made by former administrations of considering the religious question a pre-eminent problem to which other aspects of the program of the Revolution are
